CONGRESSIONAL APPROPRIATIONS ARE IN EXCESS

Authorized Government Expenses \$58,000,000 More Than Last Year

COOLIDGE WARNING WAS DISREGARDED

Many More Appropriation Bills to Be Passed This Session

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2 (UP)—Congressional appropriations authorized for government expense next year thus far have exceeded by nearly \$100,000,000 the appropriations made for the same period of departmental bills fiscal year 1923 introduced today by the United States House.

The figure represents \$120,000,000 more than the appropriations made for the same period of the fiscal year 1922, and marks the first time in several years that Congress has exceeded the limit of expenditures set by the budget.

Government statisticians are worried about the increase in the expenditures, and are warning that the treasury is in a precarious financial position.

The remaining appropriations bills to be passed this session include those of agriculture, war and navy, and commerce.

If the navy and farm bills are passed the total government expenditures will be \$58,000,000 more than last year.

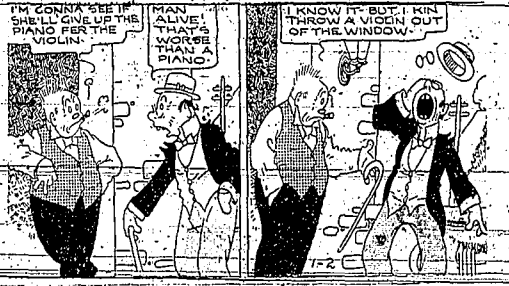
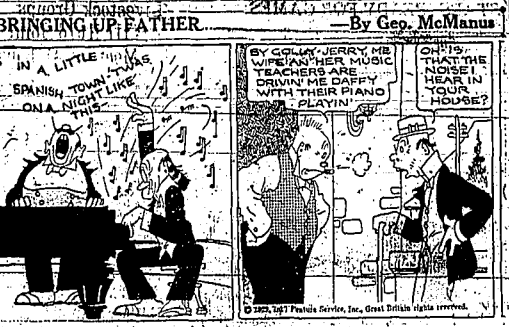
