CONGRESSIONAL APPROPRIATIONS ARE IN EXCESS

Authorized Government Expenses \$58,000,000 More Than Last Year

COOLIDGE WARNING WAS DISREGARDED

Many More Appropriation Bills to Be Passed This Session

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2 (UP)—Congressional appropriations authorized for government expense next year thus far have exceeded by nearly \$100,000,000 the appropriations made for the same period of departmental bills fiscal year 1923 introduced today by the United States House.

The figure represents \$120,000,000 more than the appropriations authorized in the bill introduced by the United States House. The figure represents \$120,000,000 more than the appropriations authorized in the bill introduced by the United States House.

Governmental expenditures are worried about the increase in the appropriations for the fiscal year at the start of Congress when the treasury is in a precarious financial position.

Shows Increases

A table of the three bills thus far passed shows the following increases: The first bill, H. R. 100,000,000, exceeds budget \$27,000,000; the second, H. R. 100,000,000, exceeds budget \$10,000,000; the third, H. R. 100,000,000, exceeds budget \$27,000,000.

The remaining appropriations bills to be passed this session include those of agriculture, war and navy, and the United States District of Columbia and Congress.

If the navy and farm bills are passed the total government expense would be \$58,000,000 more than last year.




NEW YORK, Jan. 2 (UP)—William C. "That 30 percent, while containing either a naturally synthetic or cupic, had only 5 to 20 percent of genuine liquor."

"The highest percentage of wood alcohol was one-half of one percent."

"Pieces of wood alcohol were rejected for new samples so that 10 percent of the liquor was obtained again."

"The 10 percent of the liquor which was rejected for new samples was turned over to the police Commissioner William J. Glavin, and the Telegram urged him to concentrate against them in his drive against speakeasies."

Deaths—Four per cent of samples taken in Greenwich Village showed wood alcohol, 12 per cent in the midtown district, 4 per cent in the downtown and financial sections, and only 1 per cent in the whole east side where 42 deaths were caused by poison here last October.

The newspaper said that 50,000 deaths had occurred in New York City from wood alcohol drinking in 1923 or twice as many as in 1927 and three times as many as in 1925.




Mr. Hoey is well acquainted in Idaho and the west among livestock men. And his acceptance to speak on the program of the convention has caused much among the Idaho friends.
