BOOTH POINTS OUT MEXICAN PROBLEMS

Documents Were Reported to Have Been Received From Russia

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10 (UPI)—New mysteries were added to the international foreign situation. The confidential adviser investigating committee made public its secret evidence it had recently taken to add to the case against Gen. George Booth, commander-in-chief of President-elect Hoover, had been forced by the state department to keep secret the information he had been given by the American embassy in Mexico.

It also revealed the committee was given by the Lee, public relations expert of New York and publicly counsel for John D. Rockefeller, but had been paid in full by the Soviet government for some undeclared services.

The confidential investigation was closed with the testimony of Arthur Biles, chief of the division of Mexican affairs in the state department. After the Lee committee had been given the information seeking to involve Chairman Borod of the foreign relations committee with the Mexican revolutionaries and killing residents of the border region for more than two years was in his last stages.

The official report said it had been disclosed but denied that its president, vice-presidents and other members were delegated to visit Mexico.

**LOWER SNAKE RIVER
CANYON**

(By Byron DeFoe)

EVERY year hundreds of Idaho people go down the Snake River which flows through the state, the Grand Canyon of the Colorado, or perhaps Niagara. To many of these it has never occurred that one of the three greatest canyons in the United States is near Twin Falls. It is higher than Niagara and larger than Yosemite Falls. Still greater numbers are unaware that the box canyon at the lower Snake is one of the greatest gorges in the world. It lies at the base of our Seven Devils and extends for some 26 miles between Huntington and Lewiston. The Yellow-brown canyon is 2000 feet deep, the Colorado nowhere exceeds 6000. —The Snake has cut its narrow bed down over 7000 feet on the Idaho side, and while it looks like the coloring of the others, it has a sublime and solemn grandeur all its own.

The first of the tamer descriptions is that written by Dr. F. E. Lacey of our university, who says: "The dark color of the lava on which this canyon has been carved, the black basaltic cliffs with bare rock-surfaced ledges, give the most commanding feature of Haines' interior. Even a person unversed in geology must be impressed by the tremendous depths which running water can accomplish in given sufficient time. This region would make a magnificent state or national park, and the Seven Devils might well become a world-famous summer resort."

In selecting one of the several ways of reaching this section in summer, the visitor should determine whether he prefers to look down at its scenery, or up. If the latter, his railroad service from Huntington to Homestake, a station at the upper end of the canyon but below the famous exhaust head. He may take the regular hour running up the Snake from Lewiston to the foot of the great gorge.

But perhaps the most satisfactory method is auto, leaving the North and South highway at Council in Adams county, thence over 40 miles of fairly good road to Cupra, principal town in the Seven Devils district. Thereby a minimum of 300 miles will still provide 12 hours' driving time, and the road is good, though not always smooth, except in certain parts where mud and water are to be expected.

A MEMORIAL BUILDING

THE Twin Falls post of the American Legion has received once more the subject of a memorial building, and a new survey of possible ways—so far—has proved may be undertaken and carried forward successfully being made.

The Legion has the lots on which to erect the structure. It has some money of its own, not very much. An investigation is now being carried on by special committees to acquire money in special funds that may be available for such a building.

The cost of a memorial building, according to plans the Legion has had drawn, would be \$30,000. The original estimate was higher than that, but some alterations or the interests of economy were made without sacrificing beauty or utility.

Accordingly, it has been decided that more than half of the cost of the structure may be obtained by a long time loan—"the first mortage loan plus funds on hand and other money that may or may not be available put the Legion within a few thousand dollars of its starting point." No definite figures of the funds needed can be given until further committee work has been completed.

The building would fill several needs. First, it would be a memorial to the spirit of the Twin Falls territory during the World war, a memorial to those who died in service, to those who served in armed forces and survived and to that large civilian army that gave or money, time and effort to the cause of the war.

Such a building would provide suitable quarters for the local national guard unit which would be paid for by the state. It would also provide permanent meeting quarters for a number of patriotic and civic bodies.

The local post of the American Legion has been reticent about taking its case directly to the public. The membership has assumed that it would much prefer erecting the building through its own efforts and permitting the public to enjoy a community monument without having been called on for a part of the funds that made it possible. That spirit has much to commend it, this newspaper believes, but in another sense that part of the public that made up the big civilian army that did the war has just as vital an interest in seeing the building project realized as the Legion.

Why should all responsibility for a war memorial building be carried by the organization made up of a part of the ex-service men who returned to civilian life? Is not the memorial for all of us, and should not the public be glad to join in the movement to make possible erection of the building? We wonder if the public would not appreciate the opportunity to help. We think it would. Has the public anything to say for itself?
