SIX MEN KILLED IN PLANE CRASH; OTHERS INJURED

Hugo Passenger Airplane Is Totally Destroyed in Catastrophe

FALLS INTO GARDEN BESIDE BUILDING

Pilot Fights Frantically to Regain Control of Falling Ship

ROYALTON, Pa., Jan. 11 (UP)—Six men were killed and two others injured so severely they died later today when a Hugo passenger airplane crashed here last night.

The plane, flying at a low altitude, suddenly went into a steep climb and crashed into a garden in the rear of a combination residence and garage building.

The huge ship narrowly missed hitting the house and the pilot fought frantically to regain control.

The plane was totally destroyed. The pilot was killed.

Five of the passengers were dead when rescued from the wreckage and one died later.

They were placed in automobiles and hurried to the Harrisburg, Pa., hospital.

The machine fell to the S. river air depot at Middletown a few miles from the crash.

The building which the plane crashed into is a two-story house owned by the Harrisburg, Pa., police.

Lieut. Robert Anger, of Hollingford, Wash., the pilot, was fatally injured. He was pronounced dead by all eminent men of the air service.

Like Question Mark

The plane, a Fokker Dora, was of a new type. It was piloted by a man whose name is not known. The crash was the first of its kind in this country.

The plane was flying from Washington this morning for supplies and was on its way back when it crashed in lower Royalton, near Middletown, shortly after 10 o'clock.

The wreckage and depot officials are investigating the crash.

Five bodies were found in the wreckage. The bodies were found in a hospital in Harrisburg a few minutes after the crash.

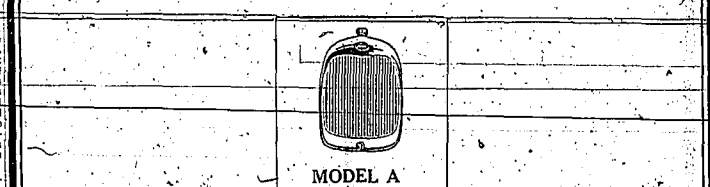
