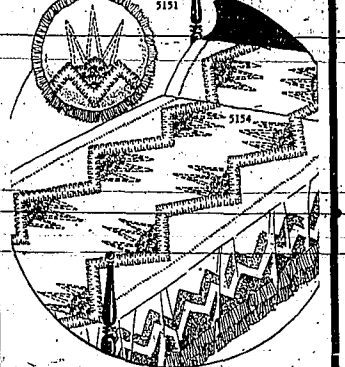

TO LIMIT INCREASES
 SOME uniformly in regulating tax levying boards in Idaho should be evaded without much more delay, and the present session of the legislature is not too soon for the job to be done.

Under the present law the county governments are required to operate and to make their levies under a budgeting provision. Other levying bodies are exempt from any such requirement.

The management may work out in such a way that the one body that has it available by a budget under present laws may cut its cost and the remaining tax levying bodies that are free to operate without budgets may increase their levies enough to increase the taxpayer's burden.

Some other states have provisions in their laws that control levying bodies to refrain from increasing their budgets above a certain set percentage each year over the budget adopted for the preceding year. In Oregon, for instance, levying bodies may not increase their budget any one year by more than six percent. The theory of the law is that some increase for growth should be permitted but in excess of great percentages by any one levying board should not be allowed.

The application of the law in Oregon undoubtedly has been to the advantage of the taxpayer and has encouraged thrift. Many levying boards take pride in preventing any increase, and even the boards determined to spend more money, whether they are counties, school districts, municipalities or any other levying body, can not exceed the six percent limitation on any one year's levy. The law has been very effective, but this paper is inclined to the belief that it is much sounder than the plan, or lack of plan, of any restrictions on levying boards in this state.

It has been argued that in Idaho the different levying boards of any given district should cooperate in trying to keep down taxation. That suggestion, like many we have made affecting taxation, is purely cosmetic. It is a "what-if" proposition. It is a suggestion that, if applied uniformly to all levying bodies, and there is no chance for one board to increase its levy sufficiently to take all the levies made by any other levying board of a particular body.
