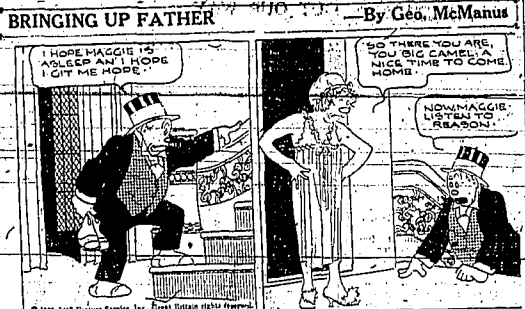

**CLERGYMEN TAKE STAND ON LIQUOR**

England May Not Release Goods of German Citizens

Providence R. I., Jan. 17 (UP)—Representative Rhode Island men oppose the Rhode Whereby Each Would Be an Unpaid Law Official.

Providence R. I., Jan. 17 (UP)—Representative Rhode Island men have taken an unqualified stand in opposition to the plan to make every Protestant church member in this state an official prohibition agent.

Under the plan, adopted by the Rhode Island state citizenship convention and approved by the state legislature, blanks would be prepared and distributed among church members. The blanks would be forwarded to the state bureau and later submitted to prohibition authorities.

The Rev. William Cadden of the First Baptist church, where the convention at which the plan was adopted, was held, asserted that his church "would not go in anything like that as long as we are a Protestant church."

The plan is a perversion of church membership duties, he added. "I would oppose it, although I would not oppose it if my church, I am afraid at all in the face of it."

The Rev. Fred K. Veining, pastor of the church of the Methodist Episcopal church, declared the plan was "simply one to make a detective institution of the church."

"I am in favor of the 18th amendment, but I am not in favor of a central bureau and later submitted to selective bureau," said the Rev. A. Mann Brown, pastor of the First Presbyterian church.

Several other ministers also registered opposition. Dr. the Rev. J. W. Wilder, Congregational pastor and president of the Blackstone Valley Ministers' Union, denounced the plan.

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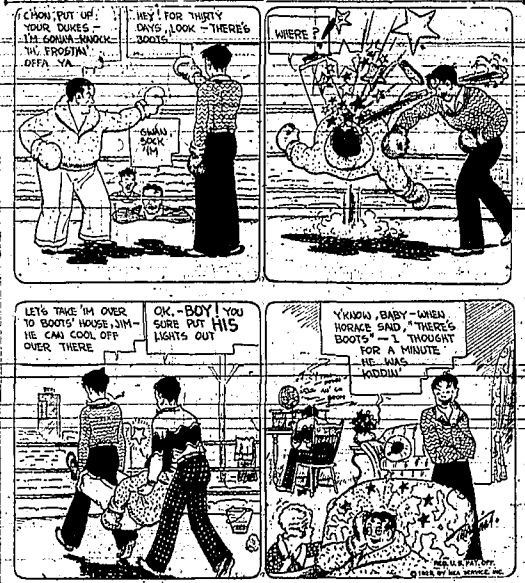

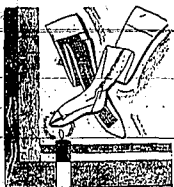

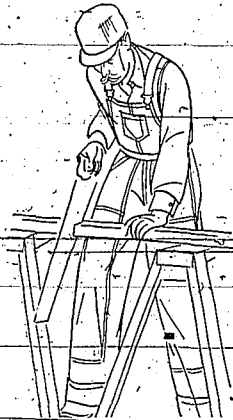
