Local Hatchery

Viewed as Highlight In History of

Game Association

Of Southern Idaho Having Met Success

In Last Five Years

Future Plans And-Ultimate-Goal

From a bold foul of men who had foresight enough to institute an organization for the protection of the game of Idaho 14 years ago, the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association incorporated has grown to protect wild life and its habitat, and to collect results from the money and labor that has been expended.

The organization was first made with a view to the methods of trapping and the methods of shooting the game of Idaho. This state, but the methods employed at that time to keep the streams abundantly filled with water were not good, so there was no money by which better means could be adopted.

Occasionally a few cans of live crickets would be sent to the government hatchery, the necessary money to pay for their transportation would be paid, and the cans would be sent to the hatchery, but there was no money to pay for the stream-flow, as very few of the anglers ever reached money.

Forward Creed.

The membership of the organization has grown to nearly 800, and it is hoped that with the conjunction of the members, and the general interest in the cause, it will be increased to 1,200.

At present the organization is the owner of the largest trout hatchery in the state, and the services included are breeding, hatching, and rearing ponds, which, together, with all the accessories, has a valuation of \$10,000. In the spring it is planned

to add another pond, and to make it larger. This will require more money, and consequently it has been decided that the membership fee for the coming year will be increased to two dollars.

Plan Changes.

"When the annual fund at the door of the association has reached \$2,000, changes will be made in the present system that will enable us to do more for the welfare of each trout annually. Quite a difference between the output and the half-hearted attempt that were made a few years ago, when the start," say Alex Thomas, secretary of the association.

The possibilities of the project have been foreseen for the first five years ago when the Twin Falls canal company completed the first dredge.

The water of Rock creek was long ago proven to be unfit for the hatching of eggs, yet the results were not good, and the water was properly aerated, and contains too high a percentage of alkaline salts, which are harmful to the young fish.

It was proven by tests to be in every way suited for the raising of fish. A few fish were sent down to the

Montana hatchery for experimental purposes.

The experiments turned very satisfactory, and the state gave the local hatchery the go-ahead for further experimenting. With the satisfactory conclusion of this, the state granted the association permission to construct a hatchery with breeding ponds. A few green eggs were then hatched, and the state pronounced the hatchery problem solved.

The hatchery has given the association considerable support ever since.

Not just now.

Now the association has incorporated, and is no longer just a name. Its members have hitched their chariot to a star of the first magnitude, and the production of 1,000,000 six inch trout a year.
