POTATO ACREAGE

A SUGGESTION that Idaho farmers plant less potatoes this year in an effort to get supply back on a plane where it approximately equals demand has been made recently by R. E. Shepherd, following the Chicago meeting of potato growers and a meeting of Idaho growers.

He has pointed out that, "prior to 1924 Idaho was producing and marketing with fair success about 16,000 cars. In 1924 we produced about 12,000 cars, and in 1925 about 18,000 cars. The 1925 crop sold for a big price, which led to a constantly increasing acreage, until we got up to near 30,000 cars, and since that would make a profit."

This gradual expansion has been developed also by other districts, where potato acreage has increased by a short cut from California to Yellowstone, has already been solved. People in central or southern California who have surplus of 100,000,000 bushels, which is estimated to have cost growers \$200,000,000. Mr. Shepherd suggests that farmers who have money for their labor, may easily make money if they plant only eight acres.

Formerly after recent suggestions about the appearance of excess of production in any crop—the persons planted and the number of bushels produced are not consistently in proportion over a period of years.
