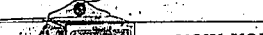

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 28 (AP).—Official opposition to the proposed reconstruction of a new center city skyline line from downtown San Francisco to the north was made of recent here today.

In a written statement, Frank Simpson, president of the Southern Pacific, expressed the belief that the "Golden Gate Corridor," linking California and southern Oregon by rail, would actually prove a disservice to the area.

Simpson's statement came in response to the application of the Western Pacific and Great Northern to the U.S. Commerce Department last week to build a connecting line through Rancho Santa to the Western Pacific at the Redwood City station near the Alameda Corridor.

Doctor Called To Minister To Child And Then Robbed

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Feb. 20 (UP)—Answering a call, to administer to a sick child, Dr. A. Lee Brown was robbed of his valise, bound and gagged and left in a vacant house last night. He managed to free himself later and notified police.

The doctor told police a man called him on the telephone about 8:20 p. m. and asked him to rush to an address which proved to be the vacant house, to attend his child who was seriously ill. When he stepped out of his automobile a man called from the sidewalk and asked him to follow him to the house. Just as he stepped on the threshold, he said, another man grabbed him, jabbed a gun into his side and ordered him to put up his hands. He was then taken to another room of the house, relieved of his valise, bound and gagged.

"They tried to get a ring off my finger," the doctor said, "but it resisted their efforts and when they noticed it was a silver ring, one of them said, 'Let the doctor thing go.' They then departed."

COOLIDGE REPEATS He Has No Plans

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20 (UP)—President Coolidge reiterated today his decision on leaving office after his second term, saying he has no intention of running for a third term.

The president was represented as feeling that many offers from newspapers and syndicates for published articles after an excellent deal, but he is hesitant and declines himself to produce any definite amount of copy within a specified time.

Mr. Coolidge was said to be disposed favorably toward no national affairs dealing with the phases of his experience in public life, but does not feel kindly toward undertaking a series of articles.

No fewer than a half dozen of the best-known writers in the country have been made in the past month for newspaper article projects. He received a solid thumbs up from various types, the white house announced. All have been taken under consideration.
