



tainly is entitled to pat itself on the
back.

Announcement has just been made
by the Mountain States Telephone &
Telegraph company of appropriations,
having been made for use during 1929
to buy land in Twin Falls and erect
thereon a two story building with the
necessary cable relays and extensions.
The appropriation for the new con-
struction is in the sum of \$60,000. An
other \$40,000 has been set aside for
use in the state to improve rural tele-
phone service.

In addition to local service improve-
ments, the company will also spend in
excess of \$300,000 in replacing and
improving long distance lines within the
state.

The Idaho Power company will con-
tinue its program of expansion which
was launched on a big scale last year.
Its new sub station is soon to be
completed. The company will spend
\$20,000 on a new store room, ware-
house and garage at Third avenue east
and Third street east. Reconstruction
of lines will be carried out at a
cost of \$50,000, of which \$30,000 will
be spent in Twin Falls, and \$10,000
each in the Kimberly and Murchison
divisions.

On continued extension of rural lines
and service, the company will spend
about \$75,000 during 1929. Much
work in this phase of new construction
was done last year, farmer customers
in the number of 599 having been add-
ed. The total investment being made
this year by the company in the south
side division of its territory under the
head of "betterments" will run to ap-
proximately \$175,000. During the
past few months the work on rural ex-
tensions being done here was studied
by a delegation of foreign power com-
pany specialists, including two from
Argentina, and the visitors declared
that the rural extension service being
installed here was outstandingly in
advance of any such work they had
seen or studied in their travels.

The Union Pacific system has an-
nounced that its train service between
Twin Falls and Wells will be doubled
within a few days. The mixed, or
train service which has been running
three times each week, will run daily
during week days beginning next
Tuesday. Officials of the line stated
that volume of business may not make
the venture profitable immediately
but that the company has confidence
that the added service and expense
will justify themselves within a short
time.

Sometimes in an eagerness to attract
new industries communities lose sight
of the value of having the industries
already located therein in a flourishing
state. The sum total of new investments
represented by budgets of the three
mention companies is as large as
might reasonably be expected to come
from several ordinary new busi-
nesses. It is cause for satisfaction that
local people, too, that these companies
are all pioneers in the development of
Twin Falls and that their decisions to

expand reflects a studied confidence
that is justified by results achieved
over a period of years. Their confi-
dence in our future, as expressed by
heavy additional investments of capi-
tal in the local field, can be nothing
but gratifying to all of us.



Senator Reed of Missouri, who can see no good

RAINY WEATHER CUSTOMARY FOR INAUGURATIONS

Twenty Out of 35 Ceremonies
Have Been Marked by Out-
break of the Rain Elements

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (UPI)—Bad weather threatens Herbert Hoover's inauguration. If the averages of past inaugurations mean anything.

Twenty out of 35 inaugurations so far have been marred by rain, snow, sleet, or disturbance, March 4 being one of the capital's most inclement dates.

The inaugurations of Taft, Cleveland, Harrison and Polk, were made highly disagreeable by the weather, and some of those spectators, like those in this year would probably relish the ceremony being held inside the capitol building, instead of on the outside, as planned. The precedent of William Howard Taft just 20 years ago.

Winter Weather

Winter has not yet got to Washington at the time of inauguration, and bad weather this year might be expected to continue through the old custom for inauguration in April or May, when the capital's Spring season is well under way.

The elements are blamed by some for the sudden death of President Harrison, who died before his inauguration, spraining a carriage presented by admiring "Tippecanoe" rode a horse to the capital, and was never seen again for an hour to unusually cold and bleak weather. He contracted pneumonia shortly thereafter.

Many men, however, had to leave their homes during the speech, and many had gathered knee-deep in slush when the ceremonies were transferred to the Senate chamber, where only a few spectators attended. This was before the day of radio and voice amplifiers, which take the voices of speakers outside of their buildings.

Great Inauguration

Both Grant inaugurations were accompanied by bitter cold, and it is related that a confused In checking of wraps the inaugural committee sent a telegram to the White House to the effect that the second inauguration on the night of the second celebration with very few outer garments.

Makes Difference

Bullet of Directors Sent to United States Chamber of Commerce for Action There

ROCHESTER, Feb. 21 (Special) — Members of the board of directors of the chamber of commerce voted favorably on all questions proposed in Referendum No. 23 of the chamber of commerce of the United States, dealing with the report of the special committee on highway and motor transport, and the resolution, it is announced by Ralph E. Thomas, secretary, and the bullet of directors sent to Washington.

"The committee recommends that in states where the state highway department, or committee, or commission should have advisory relationships or actual technical and administrative supervision of local roads, the state highway authority should be given small political units outside of municipalities to insure well planned and economical development and maintenance of the entire road system."

"The committee recommends that in states where the state highway department, or committee, or commission should have authority over state roads, small political units unable to afford adequate technical organization for their own roads, may be incorporated into suitable larger highway units, to the end that they may coordinate their respective programs to insure secure economic development."

Want Buile Plan.

"The committee recommends that the responsible authority should establish definite plans for the improvement in the effort to be conducted under auspices of a state highway department.


