POSTMASTER NEW PLANNING VOYAGE

Happy to Be Believed from

WASHINGTON, March 1—Happy to be believed from dishes in collage cabinet, Postmaster General New is planning a sea voyage to Panama after he retires from the service.

"I feel I have reached my goal in life and I shall be perfectly content if I never hold another position in government. I already hold enough offices for one man, and I was never bitten by the presidential bug, so I am happy to be retired," he said.

New said he will divide his time between Indianapolis and Washington, D. C., where he turns from Panama.


