Irish Lad Knocks Out Tailor in Second Round of Scheduled Ten-round Main Event

NEW YORK, March 2 (AP)—Jimmy McLarrin, baby-faced Vancouver, British Columbia, boy who was drawn from a fire-fight to a junior writer weight in a few days, today had another knock-out to his credit over one of the toughest fighters in the light weight ranks.

POTATO MARKET WEAKER DURING WEEK IS REPORT
The general tone of the potato market during the past week was slightly weaker. Weather conditions and proportionate deterioration of potatoes and their origin seemed the determining factors in price fluctuations.

Shipments were not excessive, amounting to 4,765 cars, a slight decrease from the previous week and 250 less than a year ago. Demand in consuming centers appeared to be insufficient to take care of any increased offerings without a decline in price. Chicago, under total receipts of 521 cars and Idaho offerings of 300 cars, ranged 100 per cent lower. The volume of Idaho stock at Kansas City was approximately 13 of that of a year ago; prices there registered the low of the previous week. Local markets in the West were totaled about the same as the previous week. Prices in Kansas City showed little change. St. Louis and Ft. Worth reported trade volumes which were in excess of the Idaho-Patier district. St. Louis disposed of over eight times as much cargo as was the case last week. However, local receipts of Idaho potatoes in the five markets totaled 419 cars, an aggregate 488 car excess over shipments from Idaho amounted to 735 cars; forwardings from Colorado were approximately 100 cars. Shipments decreased 100 cars and 1,170 Michigan market cars, Wisconsin 654 and Wisconsin 262. Cash track prices for U. S. No. 1 Washington reported as the Idaho-Patier district remained unchanged at \$6.05 per cwt. with an occasional car that had a stock high as \$6.00. U. S. No. 2 range opened firm at 46c for spot. Colorado was in demand for supplies at mostly 35c; few best high as 46c. U. S. No. 1 range ranged from 33c to 45c; Colorado available supplies at 50c per 100 lbs. Special packs were in demand. Local prices of range sets sold from \$3c to \$1.10; mostly \$3.00 to \$3.50 per 100 pounds, clean track. Bulk delivery to processors was restricted by the condition of the country. Reports in the Idaho-Patier district were that roads are reported blocked by drifts and temporarily impassable so it is probable that haulings for the balance of this week will be restricted. Growers received 40¢ to 45¢; mostly 40¢ to 45¢ for bulk packing out of U. S. No. 1 a year ago. Local estimates of a shortage of potatoes in Idaho were very recent. On Saturday, February 22, 1935, U. S. No. 1 range brought \$1,500 per 100; U. S. No. 2 range \$1,300; U. S. No. 3 range \$1,100. Local prices were mostly 11¢ per cwt. Peak price for the season was reached on March 22, 1935. U. S. No. 1—warehouse—received range reached a temporary peak of \$1,800 per 100; bulk, \$1,350 per 100; U. S. No. 2—range \$1,300; U. S. No. 3—range \$1,100; bulk, \$1,100 per 100. Bulk received, Greeley was about unchanged at 60¢; but the San Luis valley districts of Colorado ruled higher at 50¢ to 55¢ on Brown varieties. Round Whites—received 40¢ to 45¢; mostly 40¢ to 45¢ occasionally 75¢. Bulk Green varieties—received 30¢ to 35¢, 60¢ to 65¢ compared with 40¢ to 45¢ the previous week. Prices at Washington were 45¢ to 50¢, 60¢ to 65¢ compared with 40¢ to 45¢ the previous week. Prices at Chicago ruled lower than Idaho range at 35¢ to 40¢, 50¢ to 55¢, showing frozen bottoms as low as 15¢ to 20¢. Wisconsin Round Whites were in demand at 45¢ to 50¢; Colorado rule of 40¢ to 45¢ the previous week to 70¢. Dealers in Kansas City bid \$1,500 per 100 for Idaho ranges; in Ft. Worth, \$1,400 for Idaho ranges; Los Angeles \$1,200 per 100; St. Louis \$1,500 per 100 for the same variety.
