The central government of Mexico launched a vigorous military campaign against the rebels in the Vera Cruz area today as reports from American border points told of further rebel successes in the northern states centering around the insurgent stronghold of Sonora.

At the same time the religious question was injected into the struggle with the prospect that it would create serious difficulties.

Late reports from Nogales, Ariz., said federal troops were destroying railroad bridges in Sinaloa as they retried before the rebels. The rebels removed all religious restrictions in the Sonora State, being far favor of religious factions.

Admits Seriousness President, Emilio Portes Gil, in an official statement issued at Mexico City, admitted the extent of the insurgent movement to state officials and indicated that the government also was preparing for operations in Guadalupe, Ariz., in the hands of rebels.

The federal government, under direction of Plutarco Elias Calles as minister of war, was making troops both north and south, but it was announced the operations in the northern area would be delayed until a strategic force could be placed at strategic points.

The rebel leaders claimed a total of 11 out of the 30 states of the republic.
