GUN BATTLE WAGED IN SALT LAKE CITY

Women and Children Flee From Battle Zone

REFUGEES CAMP ACROSS BORDER TO ESCAPE HARM

First Schism of Important Battle Results in a Robust Victory. DOWBOY LEAVING THE RANGE; FARMERS FIGHT MORE EXTENSIVELY. Battalio Evacuated by 1500 Rebels Just Before the Federal Attack.

NACIO, Ariz., March 13 (UPI)—Anticipating a bitter battle between rebels and federal forces for possession of Naco, Arizona, woman and children started crossing the international line from San Mexico today.

Some 240 refugees, all holding family identification cards stamped on the American side of the border at noon and the exodus became more extensive hourly.

"Troop-unders General Aguirre Olachea, who deserted the revolutionary movement and claimed Naco, Arizona, for the federal government yesterday, were rushing preparations for the defense of the city.

Barbed wire was thrown around the settlement and machine guns were placed in position today. General Olachea expected rebel troops under Generals Manno and Tolpe to attack within 48 hours. One hundred men from the south United States army were ordered to protect citizens of the city.

Rush to Attack. NOGALES, Ariz., March 13 (UPI)—Rebel leaders moved rapidly into the rear guard area of the border town today by General Augustin Olachea, who turned rebel sympathizer after the federal government had secured a federal stronghold.

General Francisco Manno, second in command of the rebel army, mobilized a column of troops to deal with, preparatory to moving on to the town.

Meanwhile, a battle was reported imminent at Mazatlan, on the west coast of the State of Sonora, as two columns of rebels drew nearer to their objective.

Rebels Victorious. NOGALES, Ariz., March 13 (UPI)—The rebel army today captured the important battle expected, momentarily turning into Mexican Federal troops.

DOUBLE MURDER DUE TO LOVE IS POLICE BELIEF

Child Decided to Remain with Foster Mother, Instead of Real One; Now She Is Dead

CARLEBY-THE-SEA, Calif., March 12 (UP)—Eight years of love for a foster mother could not be overcome by the affection of her own mother in a few brief months, and today, 11-year-old Barbara Smarte, lay dead—slain by the mother who could not give her up.

The mother, Mrs. Florence Smarte, also was dead, killing herself after fatally wounding Barbara.

The dual tragedy resulted when the two mothers, the real one and the foster one, Mrs. Mabel Collins of Berkeley, Ill., could not agree on return of Barbara to Mrs. Collins. The child was left to the child.

"I want to go back to Mrs. Collins," she said.

Mrs. Smarte then asked for a few minutes of farewell alone with Barbara, and Mrs. Collins walked on the doorstep of the mother's cottage.

She was the first at the child's side after hearing the two shots.

Mrs. Smarte was killed instantly by the first bullet, but Barbara lingered for a few hours in the Carmel hospital.

The beginning of the tragedy was in 1921 when Mrs. Smarte and her husband had trouble, she then trusted Barbara to Mrs. Collins. A few months ago the foster mother returned the child because of her own grief prevented her giving Barbara proper care.

Monday she claimed the child again. Mrs. Smarte refused. Hours of conference failed to break their impasse. Finally Mrs. Collins took Barbara to a hotel. The hour of farewell yesterday was arranged.

NEW FARM SECRETARY SAYS FARMER NEEDS EDUCATION

WASHINGTON, March 12 (UP)—Arthur M. Hyde, new secretary of agriculture, believes that the education of farmers who are receiving relief from hard economic conditions.

Hard work and education—these are the things, he stressed as governor of Missouri.

Hyde, one of President Hoover's "surprise" appointees to the cabinet, devoted much of his four years as chief executive of the middle western state to urging how the legislature and advocating liberal educations at the hands of the state, he pointed out.

One Hyde measure was consolidation of the school districts in each of the 111 counties of Missouri into districts analogous with the county boundaries. That he argued, would help the rural schools.

But the legislature, of his one house was Democratic, rejected the governor's suggestion. Residents of towns—objected to helping support county schools, a greater extent than they already were supporting them through the system of state school taxation.

The new head of the department of agriculture has been called a farmer himself but his experience has been only as owner of three farms in Grundy county, Mo. He either employed managers for the farm or rented them to tenant farmers.

Law and insurance.

Attention of Hyde during the last four years since he left the governorship of Missouri has been given chiefly in the practice of law and organization of a life insurance company in Kansas City.

Hyde, a part of these four years his family lived with him in Kansas City. Last winter his daughter, Caroline, attended a private school for girls there.

But Mrs. Hyde desired to bring up her daughter in the small town atmosphere of the Hyde's home town of Trenton, Mo.—a town of less than 10,000 population. So in the fall of 1928 Mrs. Hyde and daughter returned their home in Trenton—and the daughter has been attending the public high school there.

Hyde never has advocated such farm relief measures as the Mc-

Henry-Haugen bill. He never has been quoted as any great enthusiast on agriculture relief except to the effect that he did not approve of a fee method of adding farm relief.

Specific views of Hyde on farm measures and farm legislation never have been given but by most of his attention having been devoted in public life to congressional, legal, educational and the state governments in Missouri and to advocating better primary schools.

Surprise to Farmers

Appointment of Hyde to the agricultural post in the cabinet came as a real surprise because of his lack of association in the past with agriculture activities. His activities have been mostly political, legal, educational and in connection with insurance business.

Mrs. Hyde is a quiet and attractive woman who made herself popular while wife of the governor through her social and entertaining in the state mansion the members of the legislature and their wives, the members of the state and territorial politicians who journeyed to Jefferson City to see the state's capitol.

After removal of the Hyde's from the state capital—a city of approximately 15,000 population to Kansas City Mrs. Hyde never became very active in social circles. Apparently she preferred to give a great deal of her time to education of her daughter.

Just how active Mrs. Hyde will come to be in Washington society remains to be seen. Unquestionably she is capable of holding a high place in society circles but there are those who doubt whether she will care to do so.

STUDENTS, CO-EDS TAKE TO AIR AS MICHIGAN TEACHES FLYING

BY NEA SERVICE ANN ARBOR, Mich., Mar. 12--There have been three years of American universities before this, that the University of Michigan is probably the first institution of this kind to offer students a course in how to become aeroplanes.

In fact, there is no "whole of applied aviation" or course of that kind--but the undergraduate here who wants to learn how to fly can charter his wings for all that, even though a formal course is not being offered.

Several hundred students have banded together to form an aeronautical society, and by plane and balloon are getting fully an excellent idea of how their alma mater looks from the air.

Glenn T. Felt, a member of the society, built in Detroit, a daily sealer, another has been ordered, and the university has a balloon which is also available.
