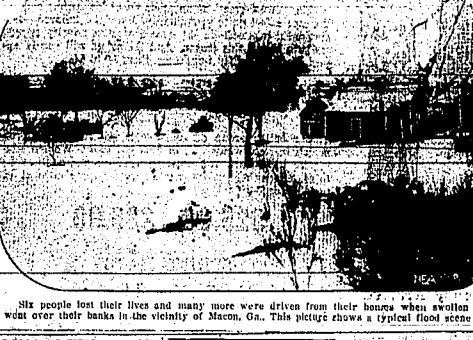

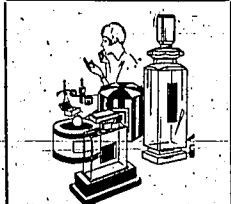

 A telling stone gathers no moss
 It must be so, for as on I go,
 I find my future is still at sea.

ON MARGIN
 IF OTHER topics of conversation pale
 it is true that nearly anywhere men
 gather the stock market and its feverish
 activities will sooner or later come
 under discussion.

The pronouncement of those in any
 such discussions is more than likely to
 be that something should be done
 about this gambling on the stock mar-
 ket, by buying or selling on margin.
 We admit to such critical feelings,
 though we hasten to add that our
 knowledge of the subject is purely
 academic.

To buy stocks or bonds outright as
 investments is one thing, but to buy on
 margin and play the short curve for a
 quick profit is a wickedly speculative
 game. This margin operation is too
 much like sitting around a table and
 being enabled to take in the money in
 the pot because one has better cards
 than the rest of the fellows.

As a matter of fact, this dealing in
 margins is not confined to the big
 cities and the stock market, not by any
 manner of means. One of the great-
 est markets of all time in Idaho, for
 instance, was staged right here in
 Southern Idaho, just along with some other
 localities, just a few years ago. Buyers
 purchased on margins of \$25 or
 \$50 per acre, held until the next day,
 next week or next month and then sold
 and doubled their money—if they re-
 ceived a big enough margin payment
 when they sold.

The development of capital in this
 Snake river valley has been done by
 marginal operators, or more correctly
 by buyers on the installment plan. How
 many substantial properties are own-
 ed, paid for and operated in this coun-
 try today by men who landed here only
 a few short years ago with four bits or
 four dollars in their jeans and an itch-
 ing to take a chance. Others tried the
 same thing and had their margins
 wiped out and lost their money. Turn
 of the card, in a large measure!

When we get down to brass tacks,
 a majority of us buy and sell on mar-
 gins whether we farm, buy farm pro-
 duce or sell merchandise. Due to the
 fact that we have a business location
 and deal in material objects that can
 be seen, handled and used we take it
 for granted that our particular busi-

ness enjoys a degree of soundness and
 legitimacy beyond what should be ac-
 credited dealers in pieces of paper
 known as stocks that are bought on
 margin.
 Is the distinction sound? We doubt
 it. This is not written as an apology
 for speculators on the stock exchange
 but to point out that a majority of us
 are following exactly the same proce-
 dure, even while we point the accus-
 ing finger at the stock exchange.

ALERT?
 A SPEAKER in talks before service
 clubs in Twin Falls a few days
 since made the statement that alert
 duties of 10,000 or more population
 will be on air mail lines within a year,
 so rapidly is the extension of air mail
 service being made.

An approved landing field is one of
 the necessities. Yesterday airplanes
 were used in war and for the perform-
 ing of stunts. Even while we have been
 getting cricks in the back of our necks
 gaping at the stunts, the airplane has
 made a place for itself in the com-
 mercial life of the country.

Roomy landing fields are not plenti-
 ful in Idaho. The business that seems
 to be an inevitable in the offing is not a
 concrete reality here yet. But it is
 surely coming. We may wake up some
 fine morning to discover that we have
 been left out of the march of this par-
 ticular phase of progress because we
 lacked alertness.

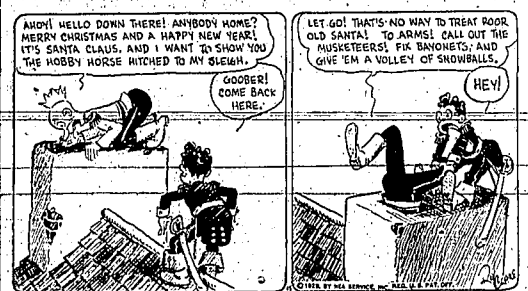
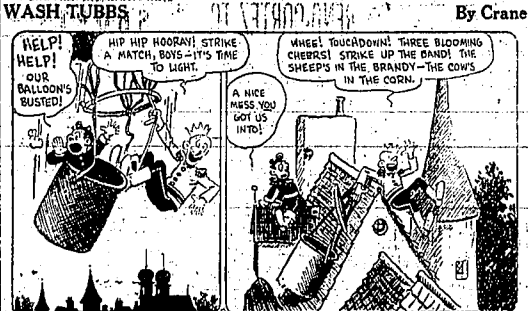

Dairying Becomes Profitable Work in Buhl Vicinity

(By Fred Nihart)

BUHL, March 15 (Special).—Dairying has become a profitable business in the west end about 20 years ago when stores were few and small in Buhl, an entry into the dairy business at a farm six miles southwest of Buhl came to town to do his trading one day, and brought 16 pounds of butter.

The business has made a steady growth. Three dairymen furnish fresh milk to the people of the town. Four cream stations are now patronized by farmers who daily carry home cream. The creamery has been converted into a cash factory, and is managed by Charles Bunker, who is president of the Jerome Co. operators' creamery association. Then milk are unloaded every morning to a cash factory, and the milk of this article would be too long if we were to describe the fine dairy herds of Holstein, Jersey and Guernseys that are now to be seen on the farms near Buhl.
