TORREON LEADS REBELS TO COLLENS' HEADQUARTERS

Torreon Evacuated by Leader of Rebel Forces

Federal Columns March Upon Stronghold and Attempt to Cut off Retreat of the Retiring Men; Pursuit by Railroad Is Cut Off

—MEXICO CITY, March 18 (UP)—Don Juan Torreon, federal military commander, telegraphed from San Pedro de las Colinas today that rebel forces, "panic-stricken" evacuated Torreon at sunrise today. The fleeing rebels were followed by federal cavalry and Gen. Benigno Barrato will occupy Torreon at 6 P. M. today, official information said. Almazan is the leader of four columns which had concentrated on Torreon where Gen. J. Gonzalez Escobar had attempted a stand with a force estimated at between 1,000 and 2,000 men.

Small Animals Use Up Much Valuable Forage of Range Lands—West of Mississippi

Jack rabbits inhabit practically all the territory west of the Rocky mountains and are responsible for considerable loss in farm crop—particularly alfalfa, clover and fruit. In the Southwest they damage alfalfa crops. During the winter they destroy hay in the stack and in summer consume a large amount of alfalfa. The heaviest damage occurs during periods of extended drought when the rabbits graze the trees and eat the bark in winter when other food is scarce.





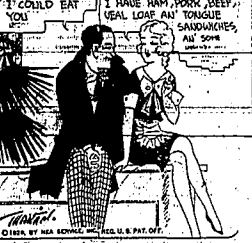
