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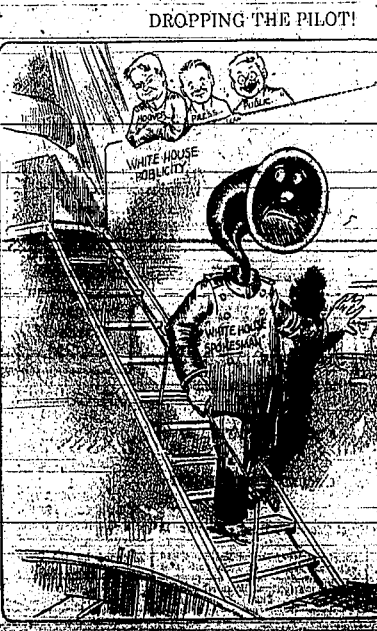

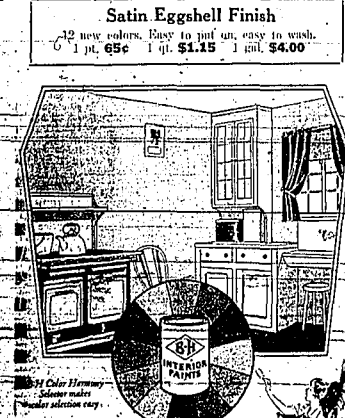

SPEEDBOAT-TITLE LIKELY TO MOVE TO FOREIGN LAND

'Miss America' Proves to Be Fastest Boat But Loses Out When Steering Gear Breaks

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., March 21 (UP)—America's grasp on the international speedboat racing title appeared to be slipping rapidly today as a result of the below victory scored yesterday by John H. O. Sorez's "Miss England" over Garwood's "Miss America" in an picturesque Biscayne Bay. Wood, forced to retire from the race after completing two of the six laps because of a mishap to "Miss America," failed to score a point since his craft did not finish.

Under a ruling of the Biscayne Bay regatta committee, the winner of each heat will be credited with two points, while the boat finishing in second place will score one point. In the event of a tie in the number of points scored, the winner will be decided on the basis of "time" on both heats. It was ruled by Wood Lealish.

Wood was leading his English boat by at least a mile yesterday when the mishap occurred which forced him to retire from the race. The speed craft under his feet was plowing through the water at a rate of more than 60 miles an hour when a steering quadrant broke.

LIVERPOOL, March 21 (UP)—All was in readiness today at the historic Anitree course for the first of a series of steeplechases, the Grand National, which will be run off Friday afternoon. For the most part the track remains unchanged. Only the "canal turn" which is located midway in the circuit, has been filled. The Grand National course is over a distance of four miles, 560 yards.

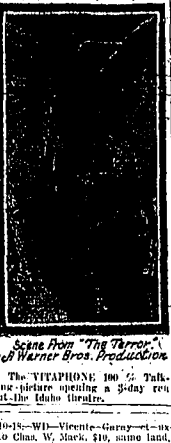

Ferdinand Foch THE end of the drama of 'life came yesterday for Ferdinand Foch, field marshal of France and supreme military commander of all the allied forces in the World war. We need not mourn his death. He lived to be 77 years old, and death overtook him only after he had given his final adversary a spectacular battle that wasted his stocky body until it weighed less than 100 pounds. He died full of years and honors, and so, we repeat, we need not mourn.

But it is fitting that we honor him, and the great heart of America, inevitably saddened by his death, feels deep reverence and gratitude for the service he rendered, the genius he possessed and the courage he displayed when on his leadership depended the outcome of the most terrible war the world has ever known. As civilization advances and as people come more and more to realize the real horror and wastefulness of war and its gross stupidity we strip it of any romance and glamour it may have had in other days and hate it for what it really is. But armies are still the final barrier of protection for nations, and armies are useless unless men are trained to direct them in their grim business.

When the heart of the world stood still under the threat of German victory, when blood and treasure were being poured with prodigal waste to the tide of German arrogance and military ruthlessness, when to faint hearts the future seemed too dark for calm appraisal, Marshal Foch stood firm. His great patience, his unflinching courage and his leadership fitted him to do the gigantic task that destiny thrust upon him.

The fact that he was surrounded by other leaders of real genius and worth can not detract from the record of Foch. He measured up to his responsibilities. He did his work. To such a man America is swift to pay reverent homage.

A UNITED NORTHWEST PLEA that the old Oregon country, including the present states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Western Wyoming and Montana be revitalized and made to live again as an entity for the honor and glory of the northwest was made by R. E. Shepherd, of Jerome, chairman of the board of the federal land-bank-of-Spokane, and president of the Idaho State Chamber of Commerce, in an address at the annual meeting of the Oregon Delegates to Congress at Portland Monday afternoon, according to the Oregon Journal.

In part, the Idaho man spoke as follows: It should be a matter of honor to feel among ourselves. There is a natural desire of every child works on wealth and trade, well as on natural objects. There is the powerful force, which constantly tends to attract our dollars across the Rocky Mountain. Once they make the journey, they seldom return. It is our business to hold these dollars. We have a wonderful opportunity just now to find a way to make our dollars prosper, and they will spend by the wheels of trade in all directions. Let us first note the use of our own friends. Make her acquaintance and introduce her to those of our farmers worthy of her acquaintance. For the states of the

west to work harmoniously together, for them to develop with each other advantageous commercial relations is of vital importance. In the early days of the history of the west, the outlet for goods the west had to sell was by way of the ocean to the eastern seaboard. Pacific coast settlements shipped their furs and gold and other metals to the east and exchanged them for the goods that were so urgently needed for developing the pioneer west.

Even to this day, we must of necessity look toward the east, but in ever increasing measure the west becomes self sufficient. Our population as a district has grown tremendously. With this growth in numbers has come an increase in our capacity to consume our own farm products and the products of our factories. We are exchanging goods within our own borders in ever increasing measure, and the practice is good for us.

Not so many years ago it would have been a real problem for Idaho to market profitably its big output of dairy products, but today, thanks to the growth of cities along the Pacific coast, particularly in California, a profitable market exists for our butter and other dairy products. Idaho sold in 1928 some 14,000,000 pounds of butter to California cities. The business was mutually beneficial.

Undoubtedly 1929 will see an expansion of such business, and the number of lines in which the northwest can successfully and profitably market its products to its neighbors will increase. Home markets are practically always best markets, and it behooves us to be alert in selling so that we realize in greatest possible measure the development of our own big district.

TO CATCH UP WITH THE DAMAGE to the state system of roads and highways about \$300,000 in excess of ordinary winter losses, it seems assured that highway construction during 1929 may be confined to projects already established and under construction. Commissioner Wood in a statement published in the Idaho Statesman Sunday intimates about \$300,000. It is known that the highway department had a big deficit at the close of the building season last fall. How big that deficit is the public is permitted to guess, but we have heard an estimate that it amounted to about half a million dollars. If the 1928 building campaign exceeded the receipts of that year by half a million dollars and 1929 has to absorb that deficit as well as an extra bill of \$300,000 for additional maintenance made necessary because of exceptional winter damage, it requires no mathematical genius to appreciate that Idaho's new road building in 1929 will not be very extensive.

In the speech from the throne at the opening of the Nova Scotia House of Assembly it was indicated that the liquor question would be dealt with at an early date. The reference to temperance legislation stated that the operation of the Nova Scotia act has been the subject of much public opinion, in consequence the government had decided to give the electors an opportunity of expressing their opinion on this momentous subject.

It can only be expected that with the "horrible example" before them of Quebec, Ontario, Utah and California, the Nova Scotia electors will give the liquor question a vote which will be a most significant one. The citizens of the Atlantic coast provinces will by their pro-temperance vote and their subsequent votes prevent the repeal of the dry act.

Nothing could be more illuminating or helpful to the electors than to see their state at the present moment to their sister province on the Pacific coast where a strong campaign has been started for the repeal of the liquor laws. The British Columbia are asking the government for legislation which would prohibit the sale of liquor at the next election. The politicians doing a government job on liquor, for the simple reason that government control of the alcoholic drinks has proved itself a most successful and profitable system. It would be interesting to say the least, if a few comparative advocates from the Pacific coast were to visit Nova Scotia during the coming campaign and point out some of the results—albeit designated "benefits" by the wags—which have come from the liquor laws. The liquor laws have boosted but utterly fallacious "liquor-control" system. For from their own bitter experiences they have seen that the liquor laws have not only failed to prevent the sale of liquor, but have also failed to prevent the sale of liquor.

THE CODE OF NAPOLEON One of the three or four great legal codes in the world's history to bear the name of one man was promulgated in France 162 years ago today—the Code Napoleon. Unlike the codified systems of law by which the names of Solon, Mosaic and one of two others in history are known, the Code Napoleon was the work of a corps of French legal minds and Napoleon himself really had little to do with it. The Code was an orderly, compact statement of the laws of France, it has formed the basis of the Frenchman's civil rights ever since—the promulgation—March 21, 1804. It was made necessary by the fact that after the French revolution the mass of the confused, hopelessly confused, and ancient statutes of doubtful historic value were critical and vital national measures studied in the hectic days of revolution. This civil code was followed, in the next few days, by three others, similar in form and affecting commerce, marriage, and inheritance of civil and criminal process.

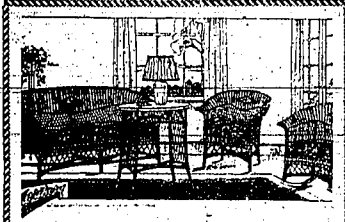
