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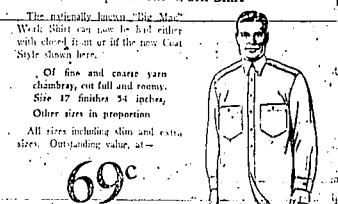

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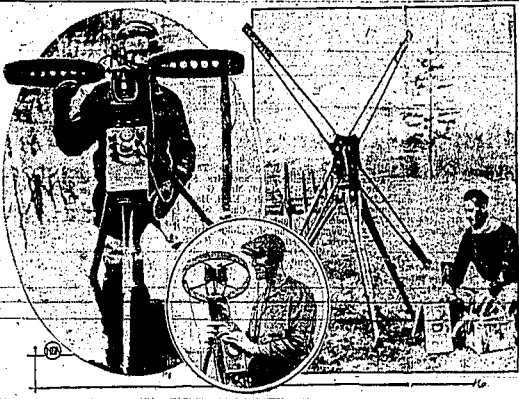
MEN LOCATE ORE BY RADIO

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Mar. 27.—The prospector has left his pick and shovel behind and taken to radio.

This is slightly more cumbersome to carry and perhaps a little too technical for the kind of adventurer who followed the mountain trails of years ago, but it's much more certain of exciting results.

It is for this reason that large mining companies in the United States, Canada and Mexico have hired radio engineers to locate ore for them which otherwise would require weeks and months of patient and costly search. All that is needed is a radio transmitter with a loop aerial, a radio receiver with another type of loop antenna, and the knowledge of geometry and trigonometry that is required in land surveying.

The most recent radio prospecting for ore bodies has been made in the Texas province of Illinois. Many ore bodies have been located in Canada and Mexico, and methods of radio prospecting have been taken up generally as a result of this. Thousands of dollars have been saved, while weeks of time and considerable effort have been obviated.

on the ground above. High frequency currents of about 7500 cycles are employed. These currents induce a secondary electromagnetic field, whose axis can be determined by means of a radio receiving set with a double loop antenna. The set is also operated above ground.

From observations made at the receiver, the location of the underground conductor which may be the ore deposit, can be calculated approximately by simple trigonometric methods.

Engineers using this process do not depend on the commercial bodies of ore. They merely guarantee to locate a conductor if one of sufficient magnitude exists below the scene of operation.

The engineers frankly state that the outfit cannot locate zinc ore because this mineral is not a conductor and it doesn't contain sulphide in large enough quantity to render it conductive to high frequency currents. But zinc ore almost invariably is found where lead ore exists and the radio apparatus does indicate the location of lead.

BLOOD-STAINED GOLD IS OBJECT OF MEN'S HUNT

Pat Monahan Tells Story of \$40,000 and Rich Vein of Ore Under Water in Butte Area

BUTTE, Mont., March 27 (UP).—Forty thousand dollars in gold, obtained with the blood of four men, has become the object of an intense search by a mining company and the subject of verbal speculation by mining men of this section.

The tale of a rich ore find, a Fourth of July celebration, the sudden deaths of four men, and the hiding of \$40,000, told by Pat Monahan, veteran miner in the Butte area, focused attention on the rich claim near here. At the bottom of the lake, secreted by 200 feet of water and a raft of blackened timber is supposed to be \$40,000 in gold, to say nothing of a 27-foot vein of cube galena.
