LANZA BRYANT IS FOUND GUILTY OF KILLING IDAHOAN

Recommendation of Life in Prison if Verdict of Jury On Case. 'HIP' DIKBERON WAS ASSISTANT GRID COACH. Defense Fought On Argument That Bryant Stabbed To Protect The Girl



COVINGTON, Ore., March 29 (UP)—A life term in prison for Lanza Bryant, 29 year old boxer, was recommended today by the jury at the trial of Bryant for the slaying of a victim at Bryant's home in the first degree murder of Lewis M. 'Hip' Dikberon, 37, a former Oregon State college football star and assistant grid coach.

The jury returned its verdict recommending life imprisonment for Bryant. Bryant's attorney, J. H. Johnson, said the life sentence was automatic and will be passed by Judge Shipman Monday.

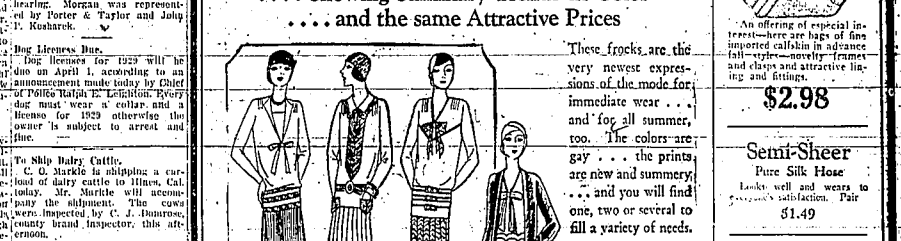
