Paris, April 1 (UP)—Ambassador Myron T. Herrick of Ohio died suddenly last night after a day's battle against a failing heart. Death came to the 71 year old diplomat five days after his last word had been for two hours during the service of his late wife, the late Mrs. Marshall Foon.

His condition became suddenly critical early Sunday and he died quietly at the American embassy late in the afternoon.

## Elks' Post-Lenten Dance This Evening

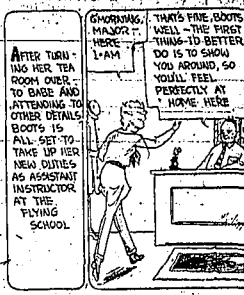

will be served during the hours of dancing.

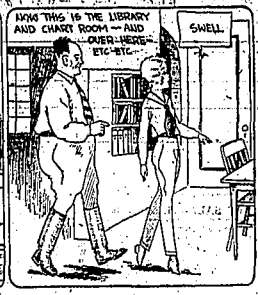
Gene Allen will furnish special entertainment feature, and Howe's orchestra has been engaged to assist in the dance.

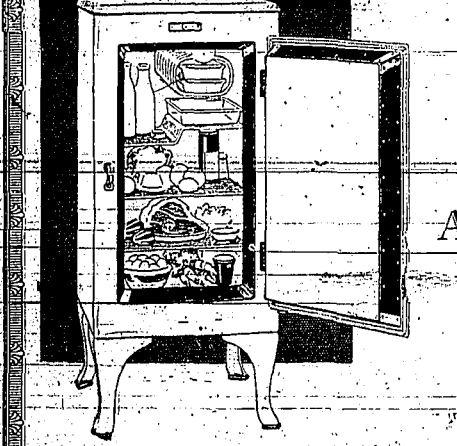

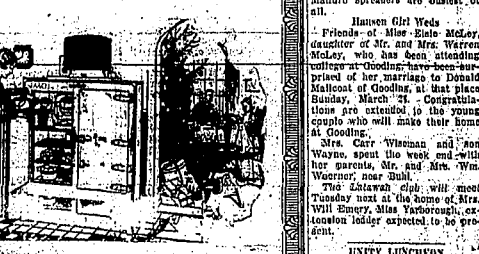
