Lives of 200 People Placed in Danger When Aim of Aviator Falls

NACO, Ariz., April 2 (UP)—One American was seriously wounded and the lives of others were endangered when a bomb dropped from a Mexican rebel airplane on this site of the international line.

The injured American, whose identity was not established, was one of a group of Mexicans lined up on the United States side of the border to watch the air fall on the Federal garrison at Naco, Sonora, Mexico.

The remainder of the crowd scattered to safety when they saw the plane drop the bomb. The wounded man was taken to the military hospital. His condition was said to be serious.

Three of four bombs dropped during the raid fell on the American side of the border, which the U. S. Customs and the American Express office.

Attitude of Administration Will be Outlined at Meet Wednesday

WASHINGTON, April 2 (UP)—President Hoover regards the problem of oil production as one of the country's greatest. The key to the problem of over-production, he feels, is the control of drilling and production. He will afford maximum production over a long period of years and eliminate the waste incident to large over production. There is an authority in the Federal Government for conservation of oil, and there is no foundation for federal legislation on the subject, he said.

To Outline Plan The attitude of the administration will be outlined tomorrow by Secretary of the Interior William C. Grazier, in a speech before the American Petroleum Institute and the Federal Oil Conservation Board.

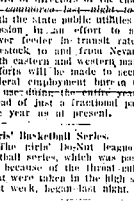

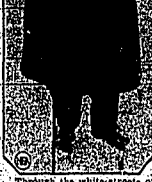
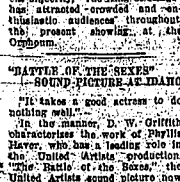
