Rings Stripped from Fingers of Women and Two Pins from Men

\$76,000 IN LOOT TAKEN BY FIVE BOLD ROBBERS

Chances of Heart Causes One Robber to Return Part of His Loot

CHICAGO, April 9 (UPI)—Five men armed with bludgeons and revolvers entered a meeting at the First Roman Catholic synagogue last night and robbed members of \$76,000 in money and jewelry. Eighty members of the congregation, including Victor Phillips, representative of the Hawaiian government, and the Roman Catholic priest, were taken to the robbery. Five men were arrested from the fingers of women. Watches and pins were taken from the men. Phillips, after being examined, was ordered from a line through the wall and forced to lie down on the floor.
