Of interest to the bean growers of southern Idaho is the report that six thousand acres of navy beans will be planted on fallowed land in Washington and Oregon, and four thousand on Walla Walla county, Washington, summer fallow acreage.

Planting will start about April 20, says Herbert H. Ebbell, representative of the Ebbell Farm Products, which corporation is promoting the growth of beans in western Oregon and Washington with the hope that farmers will make this crop rotation plan a permanent one.

The land is leased until September 25 at a rate of \$3 an acre.

Want Increase. "We are anxious to have the Southern Fish Presbytery here endorsed" by Rev. Smith, according to some here at the farm. Dr. W. M. Padon, who announced an opportunity for profitable crop rotation, says that the million bushels of beans are valued in the market as well as the quality of the soil.

Elkhart states that harvesting the beans will take place in September, and the farmers as the crop matures are to be harvested before plowing, the intention being to plant the beans in the fall. The beans will be ready for harvest in the fall.

"It is impossible to enforce the Law Without Support of People," Says Chief Leighton

A part of the population opposes us at every step, it is because that we have the respect, moral support, and aid of the good people of the community to make our work effective."

One fatality

During the past four years Twin Falls has had only one fatal traffic accident, Chief Leighton stated, and that was the case of a child struck while playing on the street.

Speeding is the chief cause of traffic accidents, he stated, and showed, according to the speaker, that 1928 more than 23,000 persons were killed and in excess of \$200,000,000 worth of property was destroyed because of speeding promises to be even heavier in killed and injured, according to the figures available for the first three months.
