CHOCOLATE WINS FROM GRAHAM ON FOUL IN SEVENTH
 Both Fighters and the Crowd Anxious to Continue but the Referee Stops the Battle

NEW YORK, April 13 (UP)—Kid Chocolate, Cuban negro bantamweight who has never lost a fight, has another victory to his record today but failed to add anything to his claim in the disputed 15-round title fight.

Chocolate won on a foul from Huggy Graham, Utah, N. Y. claimant to the bantamweight crown, in the seventh round of a scheduled fifteen round bout before 15,000 spectators at the meeting of the New York coliseum here, night. Chocolate weighed 120, Graham 124 1/2.

Two recent fights have had a most unsatisfactory ending that has caused the referee to stop the fight in the seventh round when Graham landed a low left.

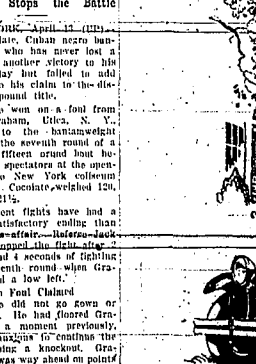

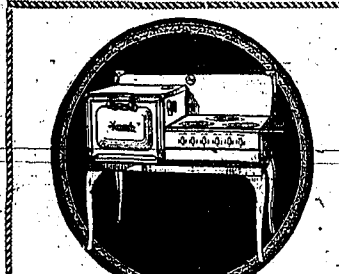
