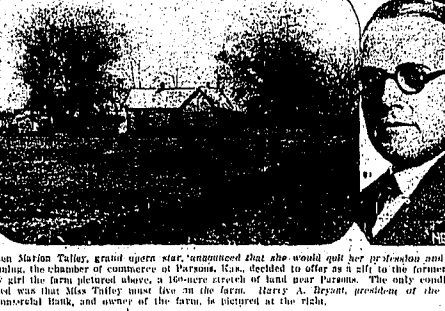

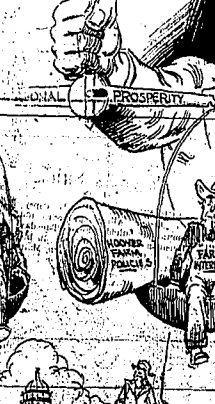

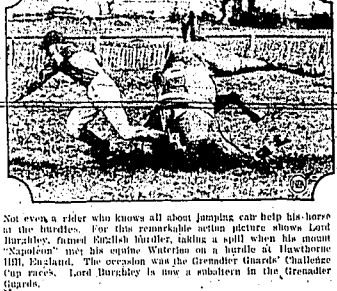

# Russian Knapweed Is Spreading Over Land

(Editor's Note)—This is the third of a series of articles on noxious weeds prepared by Ralph Bristol, Hamack county agricultural agent, at the request of J. E. Brady, Twin Falls county weed commissioner, for publication in the Idaho Evening Times. The articles appear each Wednesday. This article for today deals with Russian Knapweed.)

Russian Knapweed is probably the third most serious noxious weed in this county and is spreading rapidly over the fertile river valley lands. This weed is supposed to have entered the United States in imported Turkish apricots. It has been found in Idaho since 1918, and has since been reported as having been found in other parts of the state.

Referring again to Extension Bulletin No. 55, "Idaho Weeds," we find it described as "An insecticide resistant, perennial, branched root stalk and several leaves of three growth thick, mostly grass-like green, deeply pinnatifid, and entirely unlike those of our native species. It grows from flower stems which have been cut and are scattered all over the hills and valleys. It is a native of the Caucasus, the Crimea, and the Crimea mountains, and has been introduced into Idaho by the Russian Knapweed Commission, which was organized in 1918 to study the Russian Knapweed problem in Idaho and to develop means for its control in Idaho and other states.

### ALL ITALY JOINS IN CELEBRATION OF ROME'S BIRTH

Glorify the Eternal City in Olden Days Brought Back On The Great Occasion

ROME, April 21 (AP)—All Italy joined in the Sunday celebration commemorating the 2526th birthday of the eternal city.

More than at any time since the fall of the once great empire the city, after excavations, restorations and the rebuilding of destroyed structures, was reminiscent of the glory that once was Rome.

For the occasion the city was decked with flags and the color was one blaze of color. Troops marched behind prayer, public officials spoke and President Mussolini reviewed six divisions of Italian blackshirts.

Alto Vecellio, head of the Roman fascists, read the oath of fidelity to a great army of young men who formed the core of the fascist militia. There were nearly 20,000 of them and more than 10,000 "blackshirts" or fascist youth, the vast part of the corps.

In all the chief towns of Italy the 18-year-old youths belonging to the vaunted, which is a controlling unit of the national militia, passed into the blackshirts after taking the solemn oath. The formula to which they swear is as follows:

"I swear to carry out without hesitation the orders of the three, and to serve with all my force, and if necessary, with my blood, the cause of the fascist revolution."

The little ceremony was repeated throughout Italy yesterday, in the presence of civil and military authorities. In addition to the fascist youth, the ceremony was inaugurated by a number of thousands of public works.

It was also the festival of honor yesterday, a fascist holiday which has taken the place of the old, labor day and the nation's independence day.
