WE WERE INJURED IN TWO AUTO WRACKS

TWIN FALLS MAN IN SERIOUS INJURY IN CAR COLLISION

William Showell, Well-known Farmer, Suffers Fracture and Concussion
ACCIDENT OCCURS ON ROAD NEAR MURTAGH
Other Occupants of Colliding Autos Taken to Twin Falls Hospital

William Showell, prominent farmer of Twin Falls, received a fractured skull with a severe concussion of the brain, a severe fracture of the right arm and a laceration on his face and other bruises and cuts about his face and hands and chest when he and two other occupants were injured in an automobile collision about four miles from Murtagh on the Old Oregon Trail about 1:30 this afternoon. Mr. Showell, who was still in a critical condition this afternoon, and four other occupants were still in the county hospital today.

The other injured, who were in the car with Mr. Showell, were Lee Showell, driver of the car, who received slight bruising; John Nelson of Twin Falls, who received cuts about his face and hands; Leona Woody of Twin Falls, who was only slightly bruised; and E. J. Lanning of Twin Falls, who received deep cuts about his face and neck.

The injured in the other car, all of whom are in the hospital here, were Glenn Martin, 20, of J. H. Martin & Oakley, who was driving the car and who received slight bruising; Mrs. Neola Cameron of Oakley, who received serious scalp wounds; and Leo Tracy, who sustained a fractured patella bone.

The Showell car, a sedan, driven by Lee Showell, was returning to Twin Falls from Burley where the two occupants had been attending a "Man-of-war" meeting. 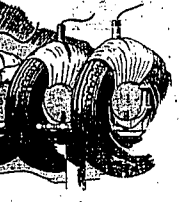

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 7.—Notable progress is being made in the solution of some of the most pressing problems of orchardists and ranchmen of the Northwest and the Pacific states, said Henry G. Knight, chief of the bureau of chemistry and soils, on his return from a recent extended trip to many points in those regions. The trip was made under the auspices of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

The value of the government soil survey in assisting orchardists and farmers to select soils which are best adapted to the most profitable fruits and other plants of their region, is becoming more fully appreciated, he said. 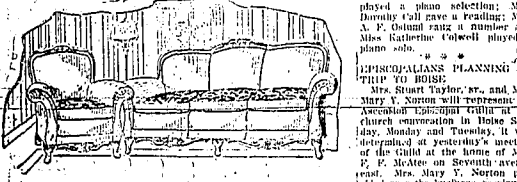
