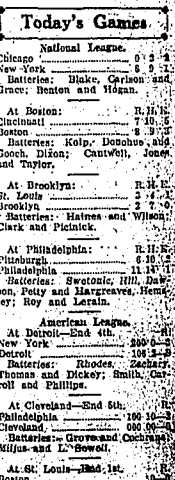

TONY CANZONERI TAKES DECISION IN ROUTIS BOUT

Italian Fighter Wins Battle with Featherweight Champion; Great Crowd Present

CHICAGO, May 11 (AP)—Partially avenged for the defeat which cost him his featherweight title, Tony Canzoneri, came little Italian fighter, stood out today as a logical contender for the junior lightweight title, which Ted Morgan now holds.

The greatest indoor crowd in history, 25,000, last night saw Canzoneri win a four round decision from Morgan, greatest featherweight champion, in a non-title bout. Although it was partial satisfaction for the defeat which cost him his featherweight title, Tony Canzoneri, came little Italian fighter, stood out today as a logical contender for the junior lightweight title, which Ted Morgan now holds.

It was an elation that there were more than 25,000 when Canzoneri won the decision. In the two other ten rounds of the night, Old man Paro, New York, knocked out Jack Brannan, Holland, in a heavyweight match, and Armand Santago knocked out Honey Roy Fineman, featherweight.
