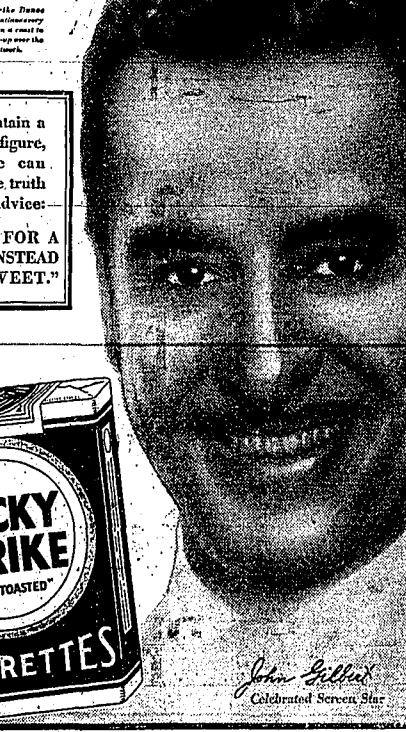

Fish to Eat Fish
About 200 sucker fish have been captured in Rock creek and are being kept in the rearing ponds of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association to be used for experimental feeding of young trout. The suckers are now being fed the spawning in Rock creek and the 200 were caught in nets. Feeding of sucker meat to baby trout has been tried in the past and will be tried here to see if it is feasible in this section of the country under existing conditions. The rest of the year will be spent in the rearing ponds rather high. There are now signs of spring in the new hatchery, having been transferred from the old building. About 250,000 trout are already hatched and about 500,000 more are now being hatched. It is also a business to produce the hatchery here to its present capacity and many of the nursery streams have been opened to produce this year.

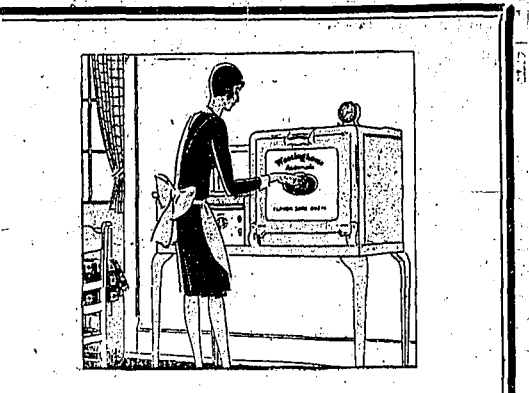

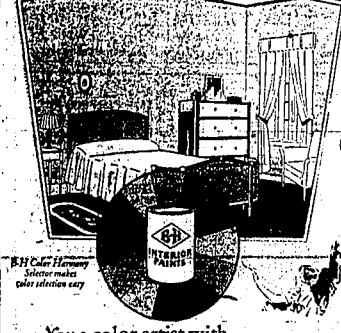

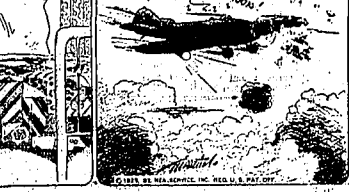
