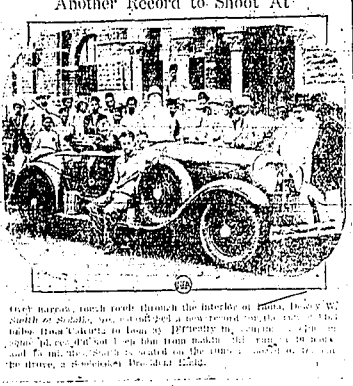

THE LABOR VICTORY

PERHAPS the victory of the Labor Party in the recent British elections may best be interpreted, in the light of a violent reaction to the unsatisfactory industrial and economic situation which has prevailed in the little island kingdom for some time. General dissatisfaction usually expresses itself in a willingness to accept a change, and a Labor administration to replace the rule of the Conservatives should be a sharp enough change to satisfy the most dissatisfied.

While the Labor victory was not sweeping enough to give the party a clear majority in the house, it was impressive enough to justify the Laborites taking over the controls of government, and this is what Ramsay MacDonald, their leader, purposes to do. He has announced his determination to take the premiership and form a cabinet.

This radical change in the complexion of the English government may and probably will reflect itself in the international relations of John Bull. MacDonald, who has been a prophet of the Labor party for a generation, is essentially a man of peace. He opposed the entry of his country into the World War and this attitude cost him his seat in the house for a time. The platform upon which his party ran during the late elections supported the Kellogg treaty, opposed the British reservations to it, advocated reduction of armaments, by international agreement, urged full publicity in foreign affairs, espoused the League of Nations as a medium for the negotiation of understanding between nations, pledged the party to the evacuation of the Rhineland and to the forming of an agreement with the United States on the freedom of the seas.

Such a platform is certainly one dedicated to the ideals of peace, and, even though Ramsay MacDonald, without a working majority in the house, may not be able to translate all of the party pledges into government policies, his premiership should prove a mighty instrument in resolving away some of the obstacles which have stood in the way of international concord.

IN BOISE JUST the other day the board of education in Boise purchased a site for a new school gymnasium and obligated itself to pay \$8,500 for the site alone. A part of the purchase price was paid out of funds provided by the student body. If Boise has to pay \$8,500 for a site alone and then plans to erect an independent building unit on the ground and provide heating plant, plumbing and all the other costs that are not to be escaped, it certainly follows that our local proposition for securing a standard sized gymnasium-auditorium has a lot of advantages that some of us have never appreciated.

ON SNOBBISHNESS ROBERT E. ROGERS, professor of English, gained a lot of publicity for himself and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology the other day when, according to a United Press news story, he advised the senior class members to be snobs if they would succeed in life. A part of the remarks credited to the speaker follows:

"Be a snob," Rogers said. "You will find it just as easy to marry the boss' daughter as the stenographer. Dress, speak and act like a gentleman and you will be surprised at the amount of snobbery you can get away with."

What is a snob? Webster's International defines the word as follows: "Snob—A vulgar ostentatious person; a person who has an excessive and vulgar or mean regard for wealth and social standing; one who vulgarly affects the manners or station of those of superior rank, especially by a display of wealth."

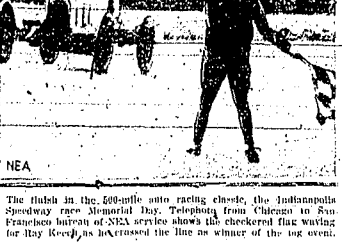

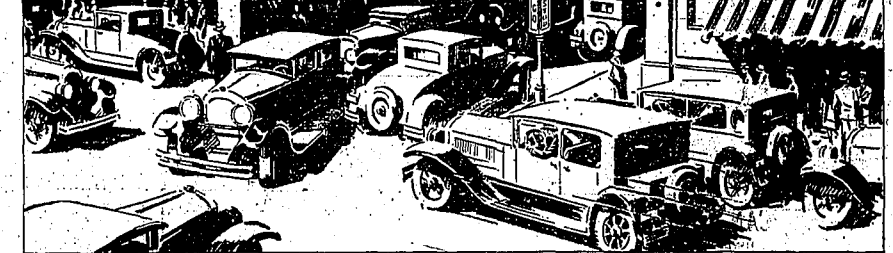

## GIANTS MAKING GOOD SHOWING IN FLAG RACE

### After Poor Start McGraw Men Start Playing True to Form Will Be Difficult to Stop

NEW YORK, June 7 (UP)—With the New York Giants three and a half games out of first place and moving through the upper division like a Kansas twister through a toy village, so gloomy that have over the Polo grounds here for the first two months of the season has been dispelled. The Giants are back in the prominent race, of that there can be no argument, and unless Cincinnati and Pittsburgh have more success than Chicago and St. Louis, they are very likely to wind up at the top place.

Two games ago the Giants, with a record of 10 victories and 16 losses for a 28.5 percentage, looked to be going no place in the league.

This was the state of affairs at the Polo grounds when the McGraw men came here for their fourth game yesterday. 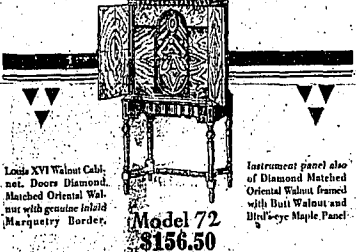
