BOSTON SLUMPS TO CELLAR AFTER BRILLIANT START

Veteran Maravilla Playing Great Game But Unable to Win Ball Games by Himself

NEW YORK, June 11 (AP)—The Boston Braves did it—the wrong way.

Back in 1914 the Braves rose from the cellar to win the National League pennant and world championship. Fifteen years later the Braves repeated the feat, dropping from the top to the bottom.

Pennant contenders in April and May the Braves are in the National League cellar today, badly disorganized and forlorn-looking ball club.

Frank Goway, Johnny Evers and Talbot Maravilla, heroes of the 1914 team, have made the journey up and down. Game 11th Maravilla, who is in his 36th year and who has been playing major league ball since 1912, has been fighting contrarily to hold the hopeless Braves up.

Traded away from a pennant-winning ball club to a second-division outfit Maravilla is playing some of the greatest ball of his career. He is hitting well over 300 and is near the top in fielding among the National League pitchers.

Goway and Evers have been playing their 1920 roles from the Braves' almost and hopeless cellar.

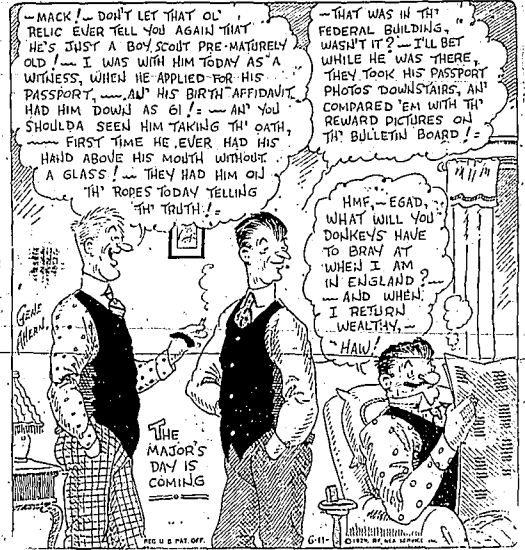
