DAWES TAKES UP HIS NEW DUTIES AS AMBASSADOR

England's King Goes Through Formality of Accepting Order at Windsor Castle

WINDSOR, England, June 15 (UP)—Charles G. Dawes, former president of the United States, officially became ambassador to Great Britain at 11:30 a. m. today when the credentials were accepted by King George in audience at Windsor castle.

Dawes, accompanied by Arthur Hays Sulzberger, British foreign secretary, Mrs. Dawes, Ray Atherton, congressman of the American embassy and J. B. Stoen, of the British foreign office, came here by train at 11:18 a. m. to present his credentials.

King George granted special permission for the audience today to enable Dawes to go forward immediately with his full program inaugurating a new era in Anglo-American relations, which the British public believed would lift to a higher level of friendship.

Dawes, who arrived here yesterday on the liner Olympic from New York, will tonight immediately begin his duties with a private conference with Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald, the cabinet leader, who has pledged his party to disarmament and friendship with America.

Dr. Snook was arrested at a detective's home by the police and taken to the police station in his own blue coupe, which had been the object of a police search after Miss Hix's body was found on a rifle range five miles northwest of here yesterday.

The young woman effectively repulsed the man's attempts to assault her but only after a terrific struggle. She was beaten and her clothing was torn to shreds before the man stopped his attack and then leaving her unconscious on the edge of a stream.

LACK OF AGREEMENT BRINGS FAILURE TO SALMON CASE

Commissioners Refuse to Call Election for Creation of the Southern Idaho Irr. Dist.

Allowing their hands over to withdraw their names from the petition asking for the calling of an election to create the Southern Idaho Irrigation district on the Salmon tract, the board of commissioners today refused the petition to elect 11,701 acres of the required 25 per cent and refused to call the election. This decision was reached late Friday after a hearing of several weeks.

The order by the commissioners is in line with the provisions of the act which is hereby ordered, with no passing upon any of the other necessary conditions, that the board of commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to declare an election for the foundation of the proposed district.

The petition filed by E. Ingraham and other settlers of the Salmon tract on March 14, 1923, had been withdrawn on the ground that the petition and the irrigation district lands to be known as the Southern Idaho Irrigation district were not irrigated from a water which is commonly known as the Salmon River Basin.

The board of county commissioners set May 15 as the time for a hearing on the petition and a task force of five members, including J. E. Parrell, J. B. Holliman and J. E. DeWitt, representing 468 acres, protested the petition and asked that their names be withdrawn. The proposed district would have included 25,170.1 acres. The acreage listed in the petition was 2,503.16. The necessary 25 per cent of the total necessary would have been 628.275 acres. The board of commissioners drew of the 480 acre lot 32,314 acres or a deficiency of 11,701 acres; ruled the commission etc.

CONGRESS ENJOYS RECESS PRIOR TO ENDING BUSINESS

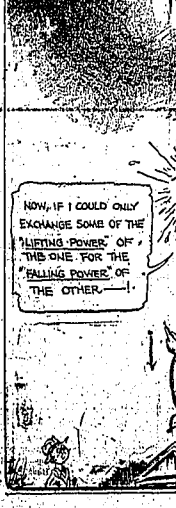
Leaders in Senate Hope to Vote on Tariff Revision Bill Sometime Next Fall

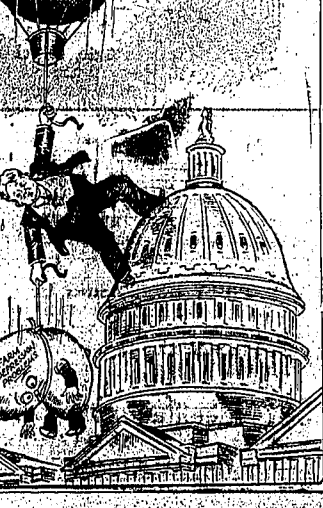

Mini-Cassia Plans To Improve Plant

The Mini-Cassia cooperative dairymen's association purchased from its patrons 36,121.48 pounds of butterfat in whole milk, 35,235.57 pounds of butterfat in cream, or a total of 72,357.05 pounds of butterfat during the month of May, according to a statement made today by C. W. Ross, field man for the association. This was an increase of 12,812.22 pounds. The association, said Mr. Ross, paid 61 cents a pound for butterfat in the milk for May of a total of \$19,984.95. For butterfat in the cream the association paid 13 cents or a total of \$15,206.74, the total paid for both milk and cream butterfat amounting to \$35,191.69 during May.

"To handle the increase in milk production the association is installing an additional five cream pound per hour separator," stated Mr. Ross, "new milk heating equipment and new cooling equipment for the cream. The plant is being remodelled, a new test room and a horse catch drive added."

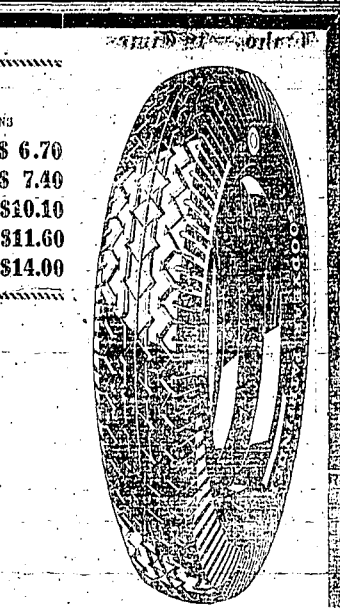
