greater than that of the ordinary man who has suffered injustice. There are plenty of reasons for suspecting that he was arrested and convicted because the San Francisco capitalists did not like his union activities.

Thus it behooves the state to lean over backward in dealing with his case. It is especially important that he be given the benefit of every doubt.

His liberty is not the chief thing at stake. The chief thing is the confidence of millions of ordinary men and women in the fairness and decency of our social and legal system.

Governor Young, haggling about "probability of guilt," has it in his power to lift this confidence a knock-out blow. And, at the same time, he is in a fair way to write down his own name as that of a small and unchivalrous man.

COMMON SENSE PREVAILS
Quite a number of individuals have marked themselves as subject to hysteria by suggestions that the border patrol and all prohibition law enforcement officers be disbanded and forbidden to carry firearms in carrying out their work.

In commenting on the Minnesota case, Seymour Lowman, assistant secretary of the treasury, stated that "newspaper reports describing the shooting are highly colored to put it mildly." He also stated in language easily understood that the treasury department has no intention whatever of disarming its agents.

Those who advocate disarming of officers make themselves appear ridiculous. We may surmise that the critics would not care to be soldiers in time of war without arms to defend themselves.

The hysterical ravings of critics of law enforcement will be received with better grace by the public when some of the hysteria finds expression in the form of sympathy for thugs shot down by organized forces, booze runners and hijackers.

When all the facts are recorded, the Minnesota case probably will be less subject to criticism than now seems true. A full investigation of the Aurora, Illinois, DeKing case has disclosed that first reports on that affair were so highly colored as to make them practically worthless as a basis for the forming of any fair appraisal.

### CHERRY PACKING TO START SOON

H. W. Jacobs Company plans to start operation Monday or Tuesday of coming week.

The H. W. Jacobs company plans to begin packing the first of this year's crop of cherries next Monday or Tuesday, stated J. S. Edwards, local manager. Some of the machinery of the plant has already arrived, more machinery is due here and some is being constructed in Twin Falls, and Mr. Edwards and the plant will be assembled this week in the Carl De Lang building, 303 Fifth street.

The first cherries packed will be from Niagara, Sproule and other valley ranches, where the crop is earlier than on the remainder of the tract. The bulk of the deliveries will be around July 10, it was stated. Approximately ten people will be employed in the plant, most of the work being done by machinery. There will be about five women and four or five men put to work, depending upon the speed with which the cherries are delivered.

Two parks of the fruit will be packed, Montmorency will be packed in the preferred class and the early variety will be packed in the standard. The latter has already been sold, stated Mr. Edwards, and will be held here in storage until it is ready to be shipped.

Mr. Edwards requests the growers to pick the fruit, with a view to the picking of a reasonable quantity on the trees. It is checked, dried, and packed in boxes, with ripening and without the stems being removed. The fruit will be packed in boxes and will be ready for delivery by the first of August. **Audibility in Mammoth Convention Hall and Ball-Room Made Possible By Electric Loud-Speaking Apparatus**

A lone speaker on the platform—537 feet from the last row of seats—can be heard by the entire audience of 24,000 persons seated in the hall and ball-room of a good sized city. Yet every word is audible to more than 40,000 persons assembled in the hall and ball-room of the mammoth Atlantic City Convention Hall by means of electrical apparatus which has been accomplished in the largest in the world, the engineers of the Western Electric Company, the manufacturer of the sound system, and the Graybar Electric Company used a total of more than fifteen miles of wire. This tremendous figure can be understood more readily when it is explained that a ten story office building could easily be erected in the auditorium with floor of room to go up.

From the central booth, located just below the center of the huge arched ceiling, a steeling rick 185 feet long and 85 feet wide, looks like a postage stamp in comparison with the floor itself. In this booth, 125 feet above the heads of the audience, an operator will govern the volume of sound by means of a remote control apparatus and telephone connects direct to the main control room.

This man is the sentinel standing guard over the huge batteries of amplifiers. He can turn the music of a symphony orchestra down to a lullaby or magnify a speaker's voice to a deafening splitting proportion. Directly below the opening booth is what appears to be a great chandelier. Composed in this there is a battery of 24 incandescent lamps. This, however, is the smallest part of the main system. Suspended from the ceiling, at either end of the hall are the louvers or "baffles" which hold the larger sound projectors. The baffles are the vital part of the equipment can best be understood when it is explained that in each of these goosadas there are one-half by four and one-half feet square, two which are six by four and one-half feet. The weight of this equipment, not including the housing is almost two tons. This was found to be the proper equipment to flood the hall—537 feet long, 288 feet wide and 125 feet high with sound.

Joining the Convention Hall in its hall-room which is as large as the main part of Grand Central Station in New York. This room will accommodate 2,000 people and has a public address system which may be operated independently or in conjunction with that in the main hall. The sound unit in the ball-room consists of a fourteen foot horn with two receivers carbide. There are also additional groups of horns to people on the Boardwalk and beach in front of the Convention Hall.

This entire system interlocks with the broadcasting station W.P.C. which is also located in the new structure. (Speakers, contracts and functions in the Convention Hall may be picked up and broadcast through this station or studio progress may be reproduced in any
