




WASHINGTON, June 24 (UPI)

F. J. Haenchen, president of the National Wood Graving Association, has announced that the annual competition for an increasing in the duty on raw wood to 30 cents a pound. The House bill would increase the rate from 19 to 31 cents.

Haenchen also asked a duty of 30 cents a pound on top waste, 25 cents on lumber and 35 cents on shingles.

He said the duties he asked for would increase the cost of an airplane seat \$1.50 and a automobile \$1.50.

Chester H. Gray of the American Farm Bureau Federation, testifying before the sub-committee, recommended continuation of the reciprocal treaty with Cuba, whereby Cuban imports are given preferential rates compared with imports from other nations.
