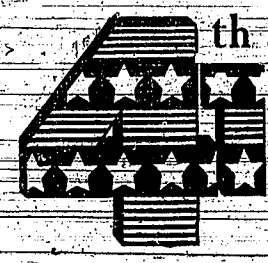

OUR TREASURY REPORT
The national indebtedness of the United States was reduced \$672,000,000 during the fiscal year 1929 which closed June 30 and now is less than 17 billion dollars for the first time since the war, according to the report issued July 1 by Andrew Mellon, secretary of the treasury. The surplus left on hand at the close of the year was more than had been previously estimated.

During the past two fiscal years the principal of the national debt has been reduced \$1,574,000,000.
Secretary Mellon's comment was that the government closed the fiscal year with its finances in a highly satisfactory state. "The statement, backed by the figures quoted, can be accepted as gratifying by the general public. We are slowly getting a big debt paid, and to pay debts is the mark of honor and success.

While we are expressing gratification over the payment of a huge national debt which will be many more years in the paying before liquidation shall have been realized, let us remind ourselves anew that we are paying a debt incurred by reason of warfare. Who does not remember the unbusiness he of as a youth some 20 or 30 years ago felt when the history books gave the information that our federal debt amounted to between three and four billion dollars. The annual cost of our federal government now is approximately four billions. We pay slight heed to that annual cost and accept the huge federal debt as an inescapable debt imposed on us by war, a necessity.

War is not necessary. It is uneconomical—costs far in excess of any possible value that may be awarded it even by those worshippers of the past and all the stupidities of which the past was heir. We should not have need of it and it is well for us to think of it in considering the cost of government at the end of the fiscal year.

HOW AIRLINES
The way in which the airplane is going to bring new prosperity to Canada is pointed out by a writer in the June issue of the Review of Reviews. This writer points out that Canada has virtually unlimited natural resources, most of them untouched at present, reaching from Labrador around Hudson Bay nearly to the Mackenzie river. And the airplane has made it possible to study this area in a way that never could have been done in the old days.

Aerial exploration not only has removed many of the barriers and hardships of prospecting, but has opened the door to a new mineral prospecting territories far beyond the reach of the article. The past year has found planes scouring the territories along the coasts of the Hudson and James Bay, dropping off a party of prospectors here and there and returning later, at a given date, to bring them back to civilization.
