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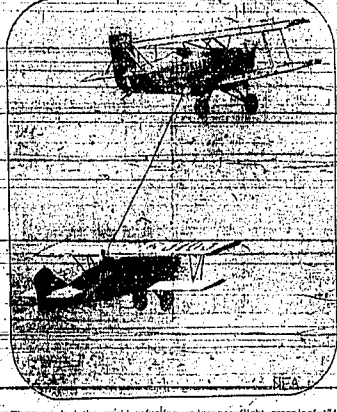

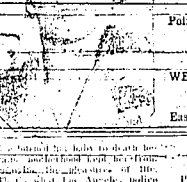

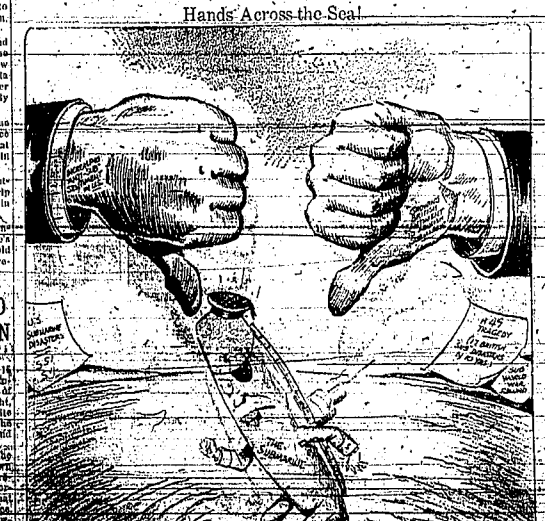

## BRADDOCK FEELS SURE OF WINNING PUGILISTIC TITLE

Twenty-four Year-Old Youth Expects to Knock Louganath Out After the Fifth Round.

**WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, N. V., July 16 (AP)—**There's a feeling of confidence in James J. Braddock's training camp.

The 24-year-old New Jersey boxer who is training for Thursday night's light-heavyweight fight at Yankee Stadium against Tommy Louganath, the junior champion, says he has the best doubt in his ability to knock out a master boxer and win a world's championship before the fight on the 24th of this month.

Braddock was not too anxious whether he will beat Louganath or take it for granted. He not only predicts he'll knock out Louganath but he makes the claim for his own right to be the champion.

"I'll nail Louganath and he won't get up another," Braddock boasts. "Even if the worst should happen, it won't be later than the ninth."

Braddock's confidence is made more convincing by the fact that he has beaten all his sparring partners—Joe Barlow, of Chicago, Albatraz, of Los Angeles, and Jim Harty, of Florida—and Jim Harty is a true indication of the Jersey city boy's condition and punching power.

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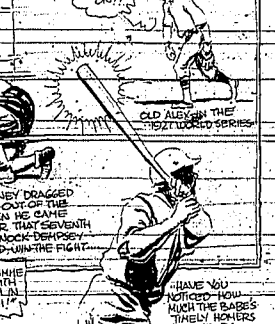
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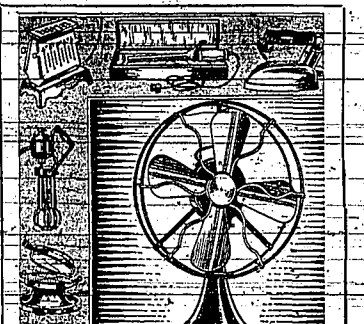
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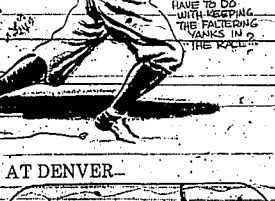

A REAL PIONEER
Some of the pages of history that are of interest to this part of Idaho and the West are likely to come into greater significance to more of us by reason of work that has been under way in Twin Falls and vicinity for several days by Philip Ashton Hollins, author and student of the history of the Old West.

Mr. Hollins by his painstaking work is endeavoring to fix the exact course taken by Robert Stuart, one of John Jacob Astor's men, on his return trip from Astoria, Oregon, to New York. The trip was made through this part of the country during the summer of 1812, a matter of 117 years ago.

Those of us who have known the Twin Falls country only as one of the outstandingly successful irrigation projects of the world and have had to depend on books for a knowledge of its earlier days may anticipate some additional enthusiasm for Stuart's work because he preceded most of us by about a century and laid the foundation of transportation routes for this country by his trail blazing.

AMERICANS ARE CHUMPS
BY THE title of this editorial we do not mean that all Americans are chumps, but after reading a news story prepared by the United Press bearing a Paris date line about a new book on the United States by a French writer we are convinced that several million Americans are chumps.

This French writer we shall refrain from mentioning his name and the title of his book spent six weeks, every minute of that long period, in this country, and according to the review mentioned above, found only one saving grace for this country. He found that our newspapers are better than French newspapers. Otherwise, we are a total loss, a grand hoax, one disappointing mirage.

Why are Americans chumps, to get back to our title. Well, the reading of the review has caused us to wonder why at least 25 per cent of the American soldiers who kept diaries while in Napoleon's ex-abiding place during the late unpleasantness did not elaborate

on them and let the French appreciate some of the shortcomings of France as seen by an ordinary American dough-boy. The Frenchmen above referred to has nothing whatever to say in criticism of the comforts of American homes as contrasted with French homes. He also must have passed up agriculture and agricultural methods of production in this country, as contrasted with those of his own country.

But let us suffice. The writer of this present bit of newspaper editorial would not try to write about France, but if a Frenchman thinks he is qualified to interpret us to ourselves and the world after spending all of six weeks in our midst, we repeat that there must be at least a million ex-soldiers in this country who are just plain chumps for their failure to publish authoritative books about France. The joker in the whole situation is that authoritative books about anything are not written after a period of study of six weeks, and the French writer is probably the prize chump.

BRING THE MAJOR BACK
EVEN though our philosophy of life is built on the principle of taking events as we find them and making the best of realities as they present themselves, we admit that we shudder for the future of our old friend Major Amos Hoople of comic strip fame.

He is out of his usual habitat. He has been in England and now has continued his journey to France. We have been accustomed to him in the atmosphere of the boarding house, surrounded by acquaintances, if not friends. Now he is being his own natural self among strangers in strange lands, and the flower of his genius can not be appreciated by the foreigners with whom he is in contact.

He is being evaluated rather harshly by those who have no way of appreciating him in his original setting. We are having a chance to see with our own eyes just how bombastic he is, the old singer. Of course, the rebuffs he has met altogether too frequently in his trip are likely to be forgotten by the amiable and optimistic Hoople. Details that have made us cringe for him will become mere memories to us, and as for the major, he will erase them entirely from his log and replace them with sweet fantasies such as entitle him to the night racking he holds among the romancers.

But, we repeat, we wish the major back home. So harshly has he been treated by those lacking in sympathy for his great virtues that we who know him for better or for worse as he really may be made to blush more in his behalf than would seem necessary. The trip is worth much to Martin, his esteemed wife, and for her sake we are willing to see the major have his journey but for his own sake—and for ours—we urgently request that he return just as soon as possible to the boarding house and Mac and Slim and the Owl's club.

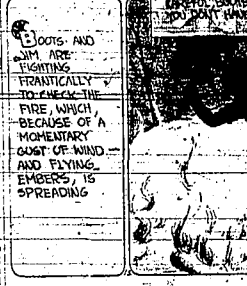

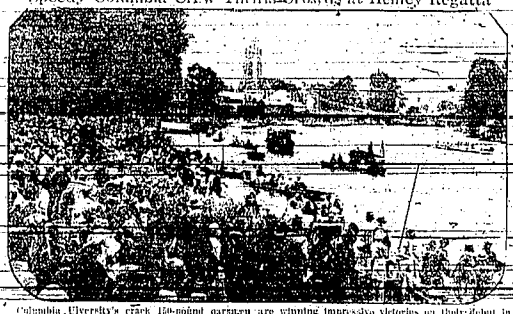

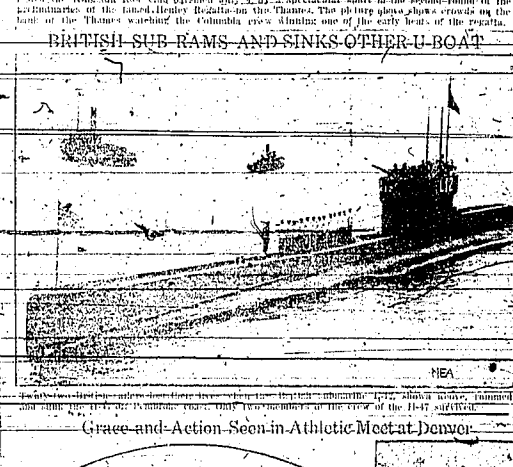
