Dry Commissioner Says State Could Do More in Enforcement

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER AROUSES DISCUSSION Prohibition Officials Endorse Stand Taken by Head of Commission

WASHINGTON, July 17 (UP)—The prohibition problem is being discussed in a letter from the chairman of the national committee on prohibition, Dr. W. C. Clegg, to the state commission on prohibition, which is responsible for the state enforcement of any law.

Modification of the present act to define functions of the state and federal governments, however, was held unnecessary in some quarters. Clegg's endorsement of the prohibition law, as set forth in the letter, was received by Assistant Treasury Secretary Douglas Lowman to indicate approval of the state's position.

It has long been the aim of the treasury prohibition commission, under the leadership of Commissioner James M. Boren, to bring about a clarification of the functions of the state and federal governments in the enforcement of the prohibition law. It is not necessary for any change in existing laws.

For some time it has been the treasury policy to concentrate on prevention of large-scale liquor smuggling and on the larger commercial bootlegging operations and all police court cases have been left in the hands of state judges. The prohibition law has been a definite complaint which has been made to federal officials in various districts.

While the treasury heartily approves anything looking toward a greater amount of cooperation in prohibition enforcement from the states, it was pointed out there is a greater amount of cooperation in enforcement from the states than there is more than they are doing in this respect.

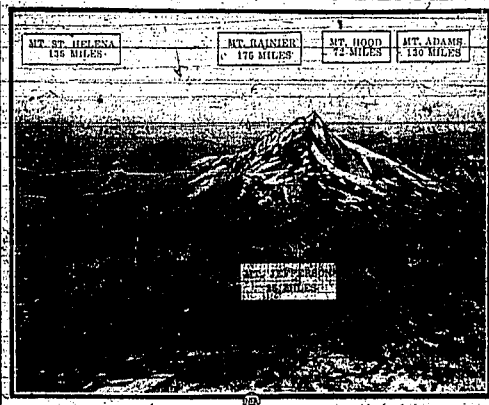

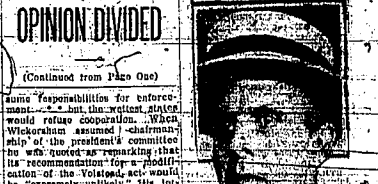

with recess in which the cherries look to be carried upward to the stalk.  
A battery of pumpkins, some on an elastic stem remove the stalks - which are taken, what is waste. The pits constitute the greatest part of the waste in the process, which is estimated to be about 15 per cent.  
One pound of sugar to four pounds of cherries is the ratio to the fruit and they are barreled and taken to the Twin Falls feed and stock company to be placed in cold storage, awaiting shipment this fall.  
Each barrel contains 200 pounds of fruit and 80 pounds of sugar, making a net weight of 400 pounds of preserved fruit.  
The official consensus of opinion seems to indicate that the farmers are recouping a heavy loss of considerable commercial value to the community. They open the way to a new crop and industry here and there for the cherries that are already planted and bearing fruit.
