Jack Wilson and a companion, named Cummings, were herding sheep on the range claimed by the cattlemen, their camp having been located at a point about 15 miles distant from the town of Alpine, Idaho, just north of the Nevada line.

The "considerable" portion of Mrs. Diamondfield Jack and Fred Weston who "represented the country" had come to the country, but later in the twenty-seventh day at January both men appeared
