FRANCE RETAINS DAVIS CUP; WIN 3 MATCHES TO 2

Tilden Defeats Borotra, But Coclet Conquers Lotz in Four Sets

PARIS, July 20 (UP)—After successfully winning the Davis Cup against the challenge of the United States, France today began the defense of the trophy in the world for the third triennial year.

Fighting gallantly after losing the two opening straight matches Friday, the United States entered the series at two matches down. Sunday only one encounter ensued—the nearest of American tennis history—Henri Cochet, 19, beat the first and oldest match. The final score of the series was France three matches and the United States two.

With the series all over at two matches down, Cochet, Lotz, and Coclet began playing the first challenge today—a pitifully sad and Cochet, world's greatest player, in the closing match. Doomed to defeat, the American youngster went down fighting, 5-7, 6-4, 6-2, 6-3.

Growing a decade of Davis Cup service, William T. Tilden brought the United States in open form with France by conquering Borotra in the opening singles match Sunday in four sets, 4-6, 6-4, 6-2, 6-3.

As was the case a year ago, Cochet bore the brunt of staying in the United States, but his former ball boy of Lyons beat both Tilden and Lotz in the singles and in the doubles. Cochet's victory over Lotz in the singles, that was enough to insure France's retention of the Davis Cup for another year.

Although Lotz's two defeats in the singles cost the United States the trophy, there was more to write in the young Chicago boy.

Rather, the critic seemed to be directed toward the United States Law Tennis association for failure to play Lotz in place of Francis J. Hunter in the international—Germany, which would have given the United States the benefit of added experience on the match he needed most, had any other—of the world test against France.

BOARD PROPOSES FIRST PLAN FOR FARMING RELIEF

CHICAGO, July 20 (UP)—A \$50,000,000 grain handling corporation, which would sell its produce throughout the world, is the new federal farm board's first idea of farm relief.

The organization would be formed through a merger of government-owned grain pools, cooperatives and elevator associations. It would be established along with cooperative farms and be eligible for loans under the "new farm" relief act. It would serve as the intermediary between the board and the farmers' cooperative groups.

Details still are to be worked out, Alexander Legge, chairman of the board, told representatives of farmers' groups and other organizations throughout the country and wheat belts when they met with the members in Chicago yesterday.

Legge and his colleagues did not believe their plan would arouse any opposition between farmer-owned co-ops and the board, but they said many of the agricultural pools and grain associations already deal in the commodity market.

The corporation is not to be a government body.

It is to be a voluntary one, but the federal farm board, set up last week, will manage it. The corporation will be formed by the cooperation of the \$300,000,000 corporation.

The chairman of various pools and cooperative associations is not to be elected, they merely will combine for selling at one big unit.

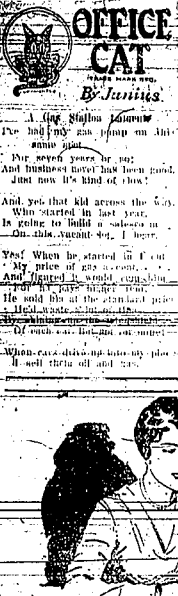

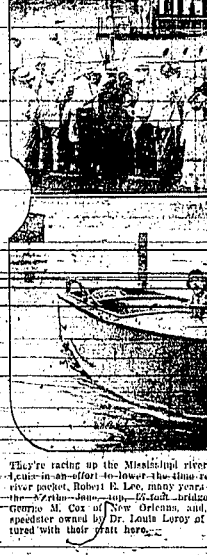
