

SOVIET MAKING HEADWAY WITH GLAND STUDIES

Californian in Berlin Lends Research Now Being Made by Russia in Endocrinology

BERLIN—Endocrinology, which is the science of the glands which govern the body's physical and mental characteristics, is rapidly being placed on a sound, scientific basis, according to Dr. Ralph A. Reynolds, noted specialist of California.

Russia, he stated, in discussing this question with a United Press representative, which is considered by many people to be a backward country, has made important contributions—especially contributions in this field of medicine than perhaps any other country in the world. Dr. Reynolds placed in the "new field" the work of the study and research work of the Soviet Russia experimental station at Sukhumi in the Caucasus, having recently received an invitation to do research in the Russian mountains of health.

EXPERTS TERM RADIO STILL IN ITS CHILDHOOD

WASHINGTON, July 30.—The art, though three decades have passed since it was born, is still in a swaddling clothes, audio technicians here declare as they forecast the wonders of television, facsimile transmission, and the return of radio to its original function of entertainment, compatible with greatly narrowed channels for point to point communication.

Allied developments in the broadcasting field and in television may bring new entertainment for millions, the improvement of which, however, will depend on manufacturers of electronic equipment and machine-broadcasting interests as centering their attention.

Although the Federal Radio Commission now divides the commercial radio spectrum into some 1,200 cleared channels, it is being recommended that international radio conferences at the Hague next September that a further division, affording approximately 2,500 channels for domestic use.

At present the allocation between short-wave channels is 1/200ths of one percent. The Commission, with recommendations and advice from the International Bureau, will make a further allocation of one per cent.

WASHINGTON, July 30 (UPI)—A joint meeting of the U.S. and Mexican delegations of the international water commission to discuss the equitable use of waters of the lower Rio Grande, the Colorado, and the Grijalva rivers, has been set for Aug. 20 in Mexico City, the state department announced today.









HOOVER PROCLAIMS KELL LOGG-BRIAND PACT IN EFFECT
