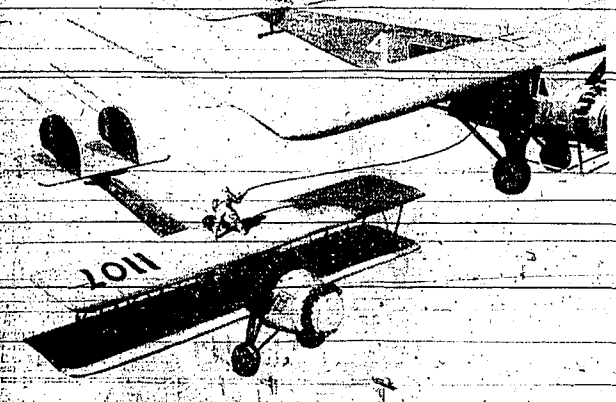

The oleomargarine act passed by the 61st session of the Idaho legislature is in full force and effect and anyone to sell oleomargarine in this state at this time, must have a license or be liable to prosecution.

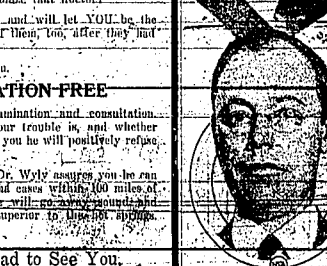
