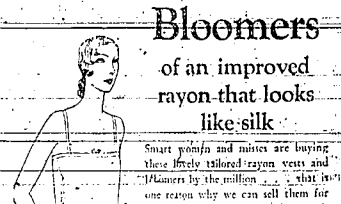

DOES NEVADA BREAK FAITH?

TALK that the state of Nevada is preparing to let a contract for road work on the proposed route from Winnemucca north as a part of the Boise-Winnemucca cutoff is of particular interest to this section of Idaho.

Let it be understood now that this part of the state is not disposed to fight the Winnemucca cutoff. That road will eventually be built.

Nevada has three main east and west highways which would be fed in ever increasing volume by the improved Twin Falls-Wells cutoff.

The Twin Falls-Wells cutoff is the most important feeder road that Nevada can develop, because traffic headed south or west from this cutoff into Nevada has several hundred miles of travel ahead of it within the confines of Nevada before it strikes California.

Not only the eastern part of Idaho is interested in seeing the Twin Falls-Wells cutoff improved through that part of Nevada north of Wells.

Eastern Idaho has a right to know where Nevada stands on this business of keeping promises. If money is available for construction on a new project north from Winnemucca to connect with a highway in Oregon which Oregon has little disposition to build, then why is there not money to build north from Wells to link up with the Idaho part of the highway that has been built and is serving an increasing amount of traffic each year?

SOME TIMES hear the expression that someone has a code of behavior that would enable him to "take food from a child, or lift pennies out of the hat of the blind man begging on the street corner, but seldom are we treated to any such manifestation.




