



WHEN 1700 CONVICTS BATTLED GUARDS



This striking picture, taken from an amateur camera, is bright of Twin Falls, Idaho, shows the arrival of 1700 convicts at the Idaho State Penitentiary, about 10 miles from the city, and the inmates' efforts to effect a wholesale delivery. Two convicts were killed, 31 injured and a man in the second big prison riot in New York state within a week.

Convict inmates, only four succeeded in making their getaway. Sixty-four guards and 14 men hurt before the riot was quelled with the first having been beaten at Clinton prison, a Dannemora.


