HEADLINES SLOW UP GERMAN ZEPPELIN

GRAPE AVERAGING BELOW 50-MILES AN HOUR ON TRIP. Steadily Slow Progress is Being Made by Craft Across Atlantic.

HEADING STRAIGHT FOR LAKEHURST DESTINATION. Radio Messages Received; All Well on Board Giant Zeppelin.

By United Press. The Graf Zeppelin, last average speed since the 60 miles-an-hour mark, or 27.7 miles an hour, down to less than 20 miles an hour by head winds, was making steady progress towards the coast of the United States today.

Position Given. The position of Graf Zeppelin at 4 a. m., EDT, was placed definitely by observations from the dirigible via S. S. Scythia. The Graf Zeppelin at that hour was in latitude 36.20 north, longitude 73.00 west—a position 400 statute miles east of Fazel, Arizona, and 2100 statute miles in a direct line from Lakehurst.

Travels 2,700 Miles. At the time of the Scythia reports the Graf Zeppelin had traveled approximately 2,700 miles from Friedrichshafen, in Germany, on an average speed of a little better than 20 miles an hour. It is probable that the dirigible will take the route via Bermuda to Lakehurst, which would make the traveling distance from Friedrichshafen to Lakehurst about 4,000 miles. Unless her speed increases, it would take 60 hours to get to Lakehurst, making the time of her arrival about 10 p. m. Monday.

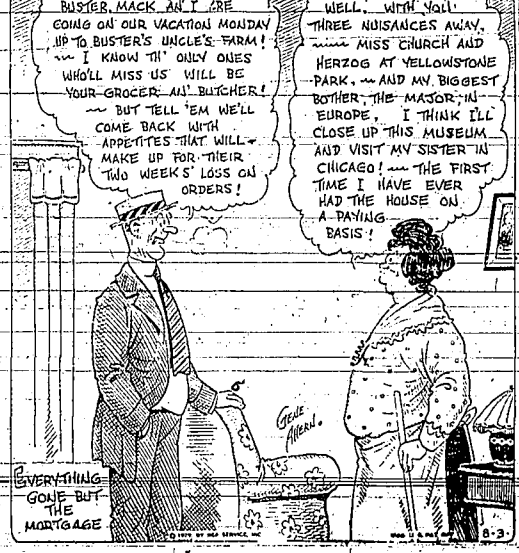

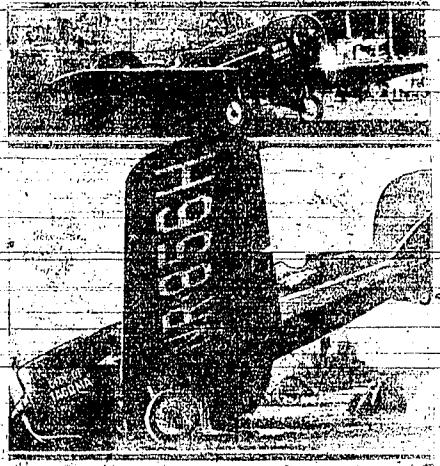

There is a deeper significance to this gathering. We refer to the educational advantages it offers. Boys of six countries are having the opportunity to get acquainted with each other, to know each other, as the representative human boyhood of their respective countries.

One of the old savants contributed to history the truism that "to know is to understand." One of the greatest needs of the peoples of all nations is to know their neighbors across international boundaries. Nations are merely organized peoples. Back of the glory of national achievements or the glory of the individual human being and if there is threat to the peace of the world in the attitude of one nation, it, too, is the reflection of the state of mind of some part of its human constituency.

In our efforts to think of foreign countries as entities we lose the vital significance of the human element because we are deficient in imagination and knowledge. Our American boys scouts, together with their fellows in this convention, are forming and giving distinct valuations of their respective countries in terms of human companionship.

Such knowledge and such contacts have a vital value in making bonds of friendship between the peoples of the world.

THE UNIVERSAL DRAFT

The influence of the American Legion on the public life and problems of this country has become marked during the few short years the organization has been in existence, and the contributions already made are likely to be markedly outtopped by the work that can be expected from the patriotic organization as it gains age, poise and experience.

The plea put forth at the convention of the Idaho state department in Boise that the universal draft be made effective for use in war has greater potential possibilities of lasting benefit to this country and to the peoples of the world as a preventive of war and as a means of winning war if it can not be avoided than any suggestion yet advanced. The statement is broad, but the merits of the universal draft support it adequately.

If any nation faces the assured fact that in case of war all its resources, both those of capital of every kind and description as well as its young men, are to be put in one common pot at a meager wage to prosecute war, then we shall see the talk about ending war put into action. Cautious is not firmly convinced of its own precariousness to submit tamely to conscription.

Even if the peoples of the world were not able to banish war immediately by application of universal conscription, the tremendous advantages that would accrue to those countries having the use of all their resources at a reasonable cost to concentrate against any enemy would be so great as to compel the adoption of this principle of universal conscription by all the leading powers.

The principal of conscription of war is not a popular one, it must be admitted. Application of it by principle by law would admittedly be difficult. Merely to think of such a thing is sufficient to make cold chills and shivers themselves up and down the spine of capital. But capital need no longer try to hold to the old theory of the sacredness of capital. Manpower to the extent of about five million men was conscripted by our own government to wage our part of the past war. Capital in the main escaped and darted up the highways and down the byways in search of war profits.

The American Legion has seen a broader vision of the privileges of patriotic service. Its vision of what is right and fair and effective makes a pattern in which the whole way and woof of the national fabric shall be on the same basis of unmeritocratic service, manpower and wealth alike, in defense of country.

One of the inspirations of this vision is the obligation that is imposed on the Legion by the realization that 10,000,000 men in the allied armies were killed in the recent war. The Legion can not escape the obligation to keep faith with that vast army of immortal dead by doing all it can to prevent war in the future and eventually to outlaw it.

ANOTHER BOND

The American Legion of Idaho is again in convention in Boise. Ten years ago the Idaho department of this association of World War veterans was organized. Its stated capital and headquarters have its annual convention often, but does hope to make each occasion when the legionnaires decide to meet in Boise a memorable one. It is a fact that the legionnaires adhered to and made real by stubbornly courageous leaders, which made this organization possible—one hour of the fortitude of those who were the authors of various acts of the service in that conflict. It was to be like other Grand Army of the Republic. It was to be like the same service.

In 10 years or more has been able to say that this ideal has been indifferently upheld by the American Legion of Idaho. The deeds of history and the bank industry at the present are earnest that none will be able to do this much such a change over in the future.

The individuals who comprise the membership of the legion are the veterans, the widows, the orphans and the children, the young and the old, the rich and the poor, the noble and the mean. All the lovely and all the ugly features of the public scene necessary to provide the legion's ideals are needed to preserve in peace the nation for which they gave their service in war.

Talked by the legionnaires for an instant, though all may be glad to forget that each to years take the toll of the boys who marched so valorously in the most glorious fight they ever made in the history of their convention sessions, the more it means, perhaps, that they are trying to remember boys, not that they are trying to remember boys.



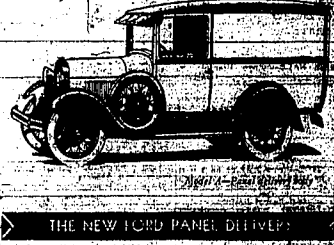
