LOUGHRAN AND SHARKEY WILL MEET IN FALL

NEW YORK, Aug. 8 (U. P.)—Max Schmeling, former prizefighter, has been turned down by Madison Square Garden, the corporation which is planned to match him with Jack Sharkey (or "Big Boy") in a championship title fight.

Instead of Schmeling, the next opponent for the Lithuanian will be Tommy Lougan, present 125-pound title holder, who will meet Sharkey in a 16-round bout at Yankee Stadium, September 25.

The reason for the Garden's action in abandoning Schmeling was that Max and his manager, Joe Jacobs, are fighting with an offer of \$150,000 for the German to fight Jack Dempsey at Asau Casino on Thanksgiving day.

Several long-distance telephone conversations with Jacobs who is with Schmeling in Spokane, showed W. P. Carey, president of the Garden, that the German and his manager are not so anxious to "throw in" the \$150,000 match as they had indicated earlier in the negotiations.

It is not putting it too strongly to say that Lougan, who is ready to defy the New York commission and hold a Sharkey-Schmeling fight, was discovered by the discovery that Max and his manager were considering backing out of their agreement.

ARE there times when you become disgusted with yourself because you are so much like your friends and neighbors? Do you sometimes wish you were so strikingly different from everyone else that you could claim to be that rarity, an outstanding individual?

The case of George Kent, reported from Bellows Falls, Vermont, as being in jail for shooting his father to death is just such an instance.

The news story in this newspaper stated that Kent shot his 74-year-old father when the older man had insisted on spanking him!

And when you get down to brass tacks a whole lot of this air of distinction that the extreme individualists wear costs more than it is worth. An old-fashioned but dependable way of attaining distinction is to do honestly and energetically the work at hand. After all, there are too few heaving to the line of commonplace duty, and to do today's job to the best of one's ability makes one "different" enough and gives one a distinction really worth while.

Then, when he returned to Spain, and the whole countryside was rejoicing over his rescue, the busy-body air minister put him under arrest for disobeying.

Now Major Franco has left the Spanish service and will go to Germany. The air minister's pomposity has proved rather costly.

WHEN AUTOS HIT TRAINS

IT is a revealing side-light on the nature of the average motorist to learn that a huge percentage of all grade-crossing traffic accidents are caused, not by the train striking the auto, but by the auto striking the train.

This, of course, means that the motorist is either extremely careless or extremely foolhardy. If he were trying to beat the train to the crossing, his judgment was simply atrocious—the train got their first with yards to spare. And if he simply failed to see it, he was guilty of an intention that seems almost unbelievable.

What we started to say was that figures show that there were more of that kind of crossing accidents last year than ever before. And just what is to be done about it, we don't know. You would think that any driver could keep from running onto a crossing that was already occupied by a moving train. But, apparently, an increasing number can not.

THE HITCH-HIKER; A PEST

A MOTORIST just returned from a cross-country tour reports that the hitch-hiker is abroad in the land this summer in greater numbers than ever before.

This is bad news for everybody concerned. The hitch-hiker, to put it bluntly, is an unmitigated pest.

To be sure, nobody begrudges the farmer's boy his right to ask for a lift along a hot road. But hard-working farmers' boys are an infinitesimal minority among the hitch-hikers. Most of them are young men frankly out to travel cheaply by imposing on the good nature of their fellow men. They are, for the most part, nuisances; and the motorist who makes it a practice never to give anyone a ride can hardly be blamed for it.

(Gallego, Abilene, Tex.)

"What is the explanation of the exceptionally wide divergence between Chicago and Winnipeg wheat prices shown in the market quotations? This question, which has been asked by one of the Herald's readers, has been the occasion of considerable discussion not only among buyers, but also in the grain trade. On Saturday Chicago wheat closed at 1.44 1/2, whereas the closing price on the Winnipeg grain exchange was 1.18 3/4—a difference of 24 1/2 cents in the first place, of course, the grades quoted in the two markets do not correspond. A Southwestern Chicago is a lower grade than our No. 1 Northern, in fact, broadly speaking, to our No. 3 Northern.
