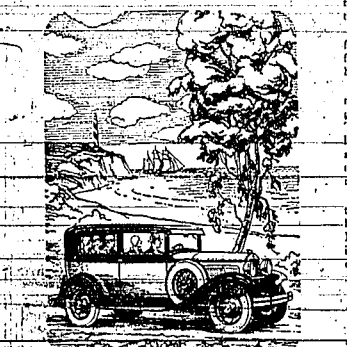

The department announced on August 1 that 78.8 per cent of normal production of 544,000 bushels of durum wheat was estimated for 1929, compared with 697,000 bushels in 1928.

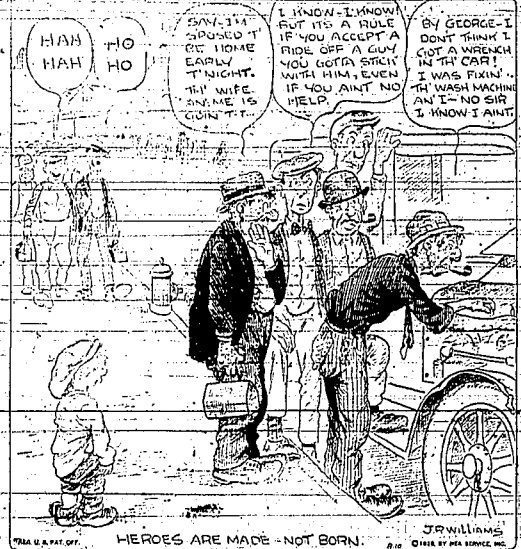
