# IDAHO GETTING MANY TOURISTS

### Auto-Association Man Checks Travel of Tourists From Yellowstone Park to Idaho.

About 75 per cent of the cars in Idaho during the Yellowstone season are being brought through some part of Idaho, according to a report of H. S. Galt, secretary of the Automobile Association, who has just returned from checking the "tag" of travel on the "park" in Idaho.

During the latter part of July and the first of August, Galt was west part of the state and at West Yellowstone for the purpose of obtaining the total number of cars entering the state and at the same time to find out if possible, just what percentage of the cars entering the state (Idaho) from West Yellowstone. His investigation developed the following interesting facts: That up to and including July 31, there were 17,282 automobiles which had entered the state through the Yellowstone Park. For the same period of 1923 there were 15,283 automobiles which entered the state through the Yellowstone Park. After very careful investigation of each car at West Yellowstone, Galt has determined that 67 per cent of these automobiles are entering Idaho and about 33 per cent are entering Idaho from Montana. The 75 per cent which enter Idaho and proceed north to Coeur d'Alene, are divided at that point, a few of them returning east over the Old Oregon Trail, and the majority returning west to take many of them returning to Coeur d'Alene, and a few to other points. 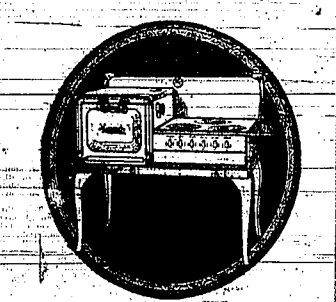

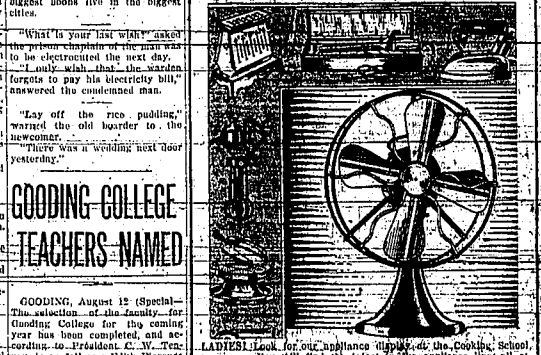
