THE HAGUE, August 13 (UPI)—Further progress in the international reparations conference was made today when subordinate members of the French and British delegations opened direct negotiations.

Previously M. Adatoff of Japan and Baron Maurice Houtart and Premier

Hans Jaspert of Belgium had been acting as mediators while they conducted their role of go-between. Louis Loucheur, the French-labor-minister-and chief of police claims

**Electricity is Provided for
More Farmers Through Pro-
gram of General Expansion**

The present program of expansion on which the Idaho Power company has been working a number of years, is now reaching a new point, as additional 276 farms along the Snake River during the first seven months of a half month's time have been added to John D. Orr, district manager.

Country line construction during the first part of this year has been completed at a distance of 11 miles below and on the 13th after previously subcontracted, the total of which now amounts to approximately 1,000 miles.

The number of farm users in the areas south of the Snake river in the state of Idaho, now stands at 2,317. Mr. Orr stated.

The program of expansion will be continued until all the major demands can be filled. The main line and distribution crews are maintained by the company in all districts, totaling 10 men.

The company, which has been in existence completed this year, is attracting the attention from both local people and others who stop in Twin Falls, and Elmer Dugay, in charge of the organization, is having visitors at the rate of from five to fifty each day and evening.

"We are particularly happy over the number of inquiries we are getting," said Dugay, "and our equipment that is a part of the plan because of the added insurance it offers of unbroken service."

LAND FRAUD PLAN SWINDLES DOCTOR OUT OF VAST SUM

DR. M. F. Schick Claims W. L. Irwin and L. O. Connor Sold Him Worthless Land

CHICAGO, Aug. 13. (UPI)—A Chicago-based attorney and his son are alleged to have defrauded Dr. M. F. Schick, Port Wayne, Ind., of approximately \$170,000, was held, investigated by police here.

W. L. Irwin and J. C. Connor, who postal inspector E. C. Allerton said formed the Southern California Land Company, with offices at Los Angeles, were held on \$10,000 bail each, charged with using the mails to defraud.

Dr. Schick said he was told the land would cost \$1 an acre, and paid that for it to Irwin and Connor, the promoters gave only 60 cents an acre for it from the Southern Pacific railroad.

Dr. Schick then bought 28,500 "town site" parcels at \$10 an acre, located in Coalinga, about 100 miles from Los Angeles, requiring it in three parcels. He paid \$100, Allerton said, and the price \$150 for the third, he disclosed, unless required, the land be used for a railroad. Coalinga claimed one acre and nothing of the others were ever improved, and the other for 75 cents an acre, Inspector Allerton charged.

The physician's third purchase was four sections of land, at \$100 per acre.


