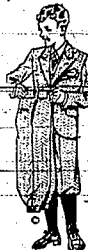

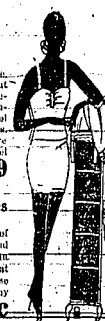

INDEX PRICE ADVANCES

AN ADVANCE of five points in the index of the general level of farm prices in the United States from June 15 to July 15 is reported by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the United States Department of Agriculture. At 140 per cent the still-war level on July 15 the index is 5.5 points lower than a year ago. The advance in the farm price index during the past month has been the direct result of sharp advances in the prices of potatoes, wheat, rye; moderate advances in the prices of flaxseed, barley, corn, apples, oats and eggs; and seasonal advances in the prices of hogs, cattle and calves.

These advances were partially offset by slight declines in the prices of cotton, cottonseed, chickens, huy and wool, and seasonal declines in the farm prices of sheep and lambs.

Changes in the indices of farm prices of agricultural commodities, by groups June 15 to July 15 were as follows:

Fruits and vegetables advanced 16 points, grains 11 points, meat animals 4 points, and poultry and poultry products 3 points. Cotton and cottonseed declined 1 point and dairy products remained unchanged.

The farm price of hogs showed a seasonable advance of 5 per cent for the country as a whole from June 6 to July 15. This advance was accompanied by a decline in market receipts. The corn-hog ratio for the United States at 11.3 on July 15, was the same as on June 15.

CONSIDER THE MOTORIST

ONE TWIN FALLS motorist has suggested that some kind of a tax be placed on jay-walkers in this city—says they use the streets more than the motorists.

Consider the poor automobile driver. He pays four cents a gallon state gasoline tax to keep the highways in good shape and then receives curses and abuse when he skids to a stop at the side of some jay-walker who has darted out suddenly from a row of parked cars at the curbing, using the thoroughfare as a sidewalk.

The men, women and children of this city have apparently forgotten that Twin Falls has street intersection crossings with safety zones where the pedestrian has the right of way. At any rate they prefer, apparently, to walk across the street at any point where it pleases them, much to the discomfort of the auto driver who must apply all brakes or be adept at dodging to avoid striking the jay-walker.

Any afternoon in Twin Falls will see some driver skid his car to a stop, breaks squealing, to avoid hitting a pedestrian crossing the street in the center of a block.

Few of these jay-walkers have been struck down by autos, it is true, but because most autos have good brakes does not prohibit the possibility of some jay-walker being killed or maimed.

A driver in Twin Falls has troubles enough keeping his eye on parked cars on the main streets; every car being required by city ordinance to back out and move every hour. A driver is oftentimes required to swing to his left and speed in to grade some auto-backing from the curb, only to find when doing this that several jay-walking pedestrians obstruct his path. He stops quickly and the backing car jams into him, damaging fenders and running boards, all because of the pedestrian's error. The average jay-walker, seeing a car approaching, will glance, undecided as to whether to retreat or advance, and a responsibility rests with the auto driver.

We appeal to the people of Twin Falls to consider the poor motorist and employ the official crossing zones at intersections instead of jay-walking. The problem is one for the individual. Take a little more time and walk to the intersection to cross the street. Do it for your own safety. You will incidentally speed up traffic, prevent needless minor auto crashes and greatly relieve the mental tension of the motorist.

A PROFITABLE INVESTMENT

IF YOU have been wondering whether the great Boulder Dam project could ever really pay its own construction and operating costs through the sale of electricity it will generate, consider this bit of news from Washington:

Although the dam is not yet past the blue print stage, various power companies have already applied for about twice as much power as the dam will ever be able to generate.

No one knows, just now, whether the government is going to produce and market all of this power on its own hook or whether it will lease production rights to private concerns. But it is evident that whichever course it adopts, it at least is assured of a good return on its investment.

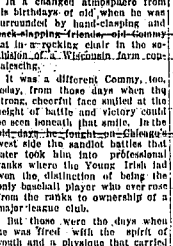

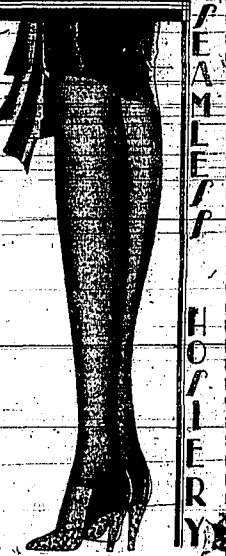
