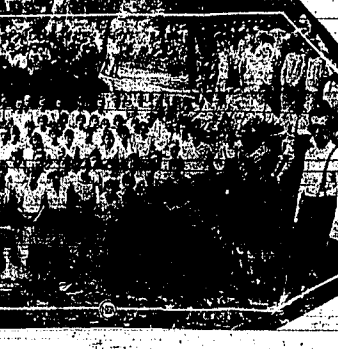

UNPREPARED IN THE AIR?
DESPITE all the progress America has made in aviation in recent years, the nation cannot yet consider itself properly prepared in the air, in a military sense, according to Rear Admiral W. A. Moffett, chief of aeronautics in the U. S. navy.

Admiral Moffett told Culver Military academy summer school students the other day that Germany, despite her defeat in the World War, leads the entire world in aviation, "both in expenditures and progress." He urged an upbuilding of Uncle Sam's aerial defense, remarking that the navy needs at least four more modern aircraft carriers.

Probably it is a surprise to most of us to hear that our military aviation is not well up to standard. There is one comfort, however; we are undoubtedly making vast progress. The quick development of a huge air force in time of war would be far easier task now than it was in 1917.

ETERNAL?

SIZING UP A GIFT HORSE AT SALT LAKE
 (Spokesman-Review)
 One of the "biggest" of the Salt Lake conference last night was a gift horse in the mouth" after Assistant Secretary Dixon of Montana had presented President Hoover's plan for donating the remaining public domain to the individual states. The many years a campaign has been carried out for the surrender by the federal government of its remaining public domain, the water power and the minerals. President Hoover's counter proposition has too many reservations to suit these advocates. He wants the obligation to remain the national park, Indian reservations and forest reserves. His tentative offer to the states is limited to the surface rights of the remaining scattered public domain, having little value for grazing purposes.

The president believes that the individual states are more capable of dealing with the remaining matters that require a large measure of local understanding. There will not, however, be entire agreement with that view. Our legislative sessions are held only once in two years and that haphazard, legislatures would be incompetent to take on national responsibilities. It can not be said that the president's suggestion is not a good one. It is a step toward the realization of the interests that have had a great deal of the federal and national resources in public hands. But Mr. Dixon reminded these who proposed to turn over to the western states all the deposits of coal, oil, phosphates, and other minerals that would be reflected directly by Congress. For that matter, the president's suggestion is subject to congressional consideration, and is only advisory.

That is the case, too, with his suggestion that the reclamation activities of the federal government be transferred to the states. The reclamation work is a construction as results in water storage, and that at their completion the entire works be handed over to the states with the obligation for repayment. The reclamation fund exceeds of such revenues as such as from electrical power, and in some cases for the sale of water, until the outlay has been repaid.

The president's purpose in these suggestions is commendable—to reduce the bureaucratic activities of the federal government, to transfer to the states the responsibility. His ideas are not before the public and Congress for consideration, and out of thought and discussion a better plan may be developed.

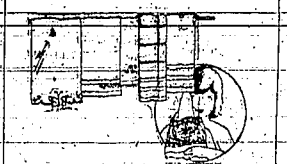
