

Court to Pass on Statute Conflict On License Money

A state court will be asked to pass upon a conflict in statutes concerning the distribution of the motor vehicle license fees in Twin Falls county during the past year. The commissioners were in heavy taxes to pay bond interest and principal on road and bridge construction, and it is believed that this may be as high as the 20 per cent of the license fees collected by the county.

The attorneys for the highway department have filed a motion that the commissioners be enjoined from collecting the 20 per cent of the license fees which the commissioners have been using to pay interest on the bonds.

Whether or not the commissioners will have to pay this record sum to the county is not known.

Should the commissioners have levied a property tax for the bonds and interest instead of using the license fees for the purpose, the commissioners would be compelled to make a special property tax levy to raise the funds which have already been paid on the bonds.
